# *Keeping Pace With NYS & Diocesan Guidelines*

Effective now:

**If you have been fully vaccinated**, wearing a mask in the Church or Parish Center is now optional.

**If you have not been fully vaccinated**, you continue to be responsible for wearing a mask in the Church and Parish Center in accordance with the federal and state's implementation of the CDC guidance.

In either case, for the health, safety, and respect of others, we ask you to continue to use common sense in maintaining social distance from others when choosing your seat in the church.

At Communion time, for the safety of all, please receive the Host in your hands, step to the side, place the Host in your mouth, and return to your pew. Please consume the Eucharist before returning to your seat.

If you want to receive Communion on your tongue, please go to the very end of the priest's line for the safety of everyone.

The Bishop's dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation due to the ongoing pandemic has been lifted. As usual, this obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, those with serious underlying health conditions or those who are caring for a vulnerable family member.

Our Sunday worship will continue to be livestreamed on Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 11am, and will continue to be posted on the website for those who fall into any of the categories listed above.

Our priority continues to be for the safety and health of everyone. We appreciate your patience, understanding and cooperation, and will continue to keep you updated on changes as we move forward.

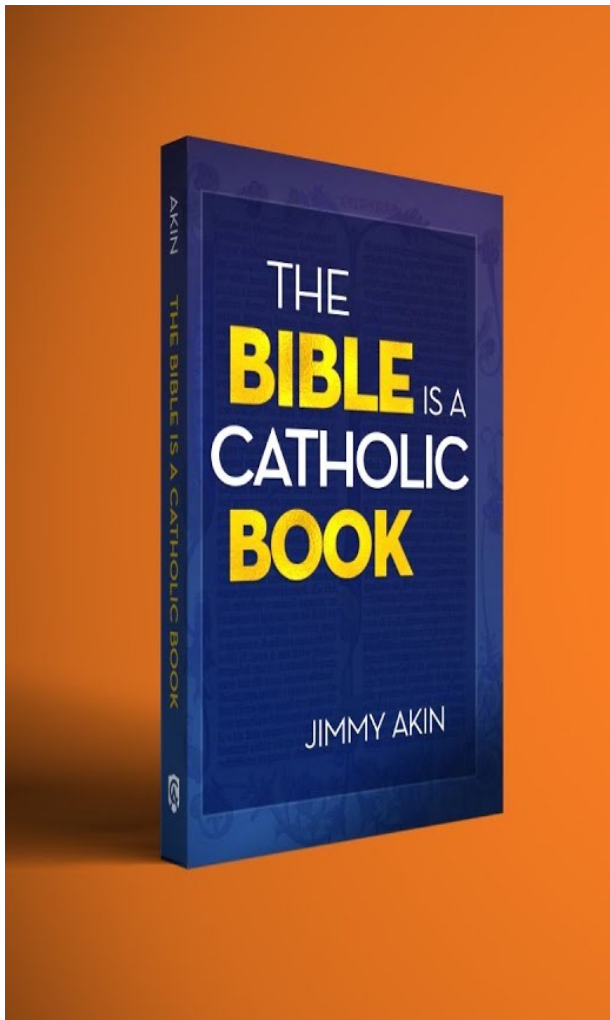
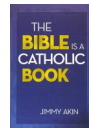

### Love One Another

Jesus gives the disciples — and us — a new commandment in today's Gospel reading from John, *"As I have loved you, so you also should love one another."* "Love One Another" — three words which seem so simple and easy on the surface, right?

Our initial reaction is to say of course we do that instinctively; we love the people who have meaning in our lives, family, friends — what's so hard about that? If only it was as easy as loving the people who love you back! Jesus continues, *"This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."* And it is with this one sentence that Christ brings this commandment to a whole new level, one that can be very challenging. Jesus broadens the scope to include everyone — EVERYONE!!

Jesus is asking us to be examples of Christian love, not only in our families, but in our larger communities, workplaces, country and throughout the world. This commandment covers everyone from your disgruntled neighbor next door to refugees in far flung parts of the globe — and all those in between. We are called and challenged to love them as God's children and respect the dignity of all as brothers and sisters in Christ.

The one thing about Jesus was that He never put up obstacles to His love; He welcomed all. The bible is full of incidences of Christ spending time with tax collectors, adulterers and others not accepted by the society in which He lived. Jesus led by example and now, over 2,000 years later, He continues to command His Church, clergy and all of us, the Body of Christ, to do likewise. There's no mistaking Jesus' intent — it's right there in John's Gospel in black and white. The question is — are we still willing and capable of making the effort?

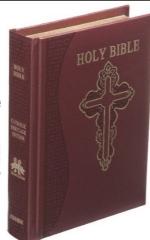
