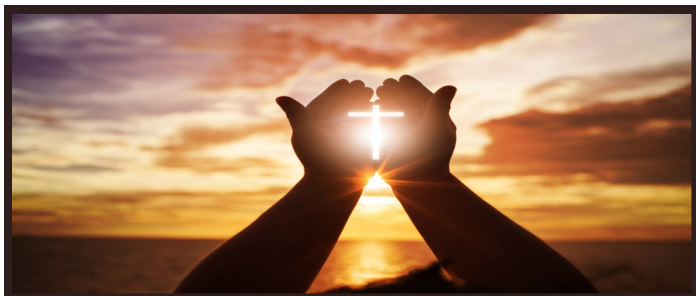

Keeping Pace With NYS & Diocesan Guidelines

Effective now:

If you have been fully vaccinated, wearing a mask in the Church or Parish Center is now optional.

If you have not been fully vaccinated, you continue to be responsible for wearing a mask in the Church and Parish Center in accordance with the federal and state's implementation of the CDC guidance.

In either case, for the health, safety, and respect of others, we ask you to continue to use common sense in maintaining social distance from others when choosing your seat in the church.

At Communion time, for the safety of all, please receive the Host in your hands, step to the side, place the Host in your mouth, and return to your pew. Please consume the Eucharist before returning to your seat.

If you want to receive Communion on your tongue, please go to the very end of the priest's line for the safety of everyone.

The Bishop's dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation due to the ongoing pandemic has been lifted. As usual, this obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, those with serious underlying health conditions or those who are caring for a vulnerable family member.

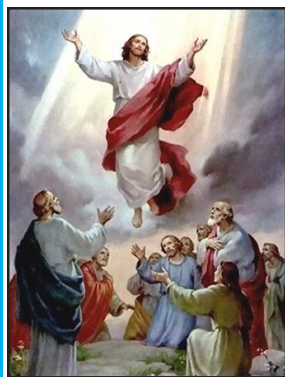

The Gift of Peace

Today in John's Gospel we hear Jesus talking to his disciples, once again giving them a message of love and reassurance, *"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you."* These words should be familiar to us; they are also said at Mass each week by the priest just prior to us exchanging a sign of peace with one another. In fact, these words may be so familiar to us that we don't really take note of the importance of them in the way that we should.

When we think of the word *peace*, what comes to mind? We pray for peace among nations, peace in our families and perhaps crave peace and quiet from our busy lives — all positive things certainly, but only temporary in nature. Unfortunately, there will always be another international conflict or war, another family crisis, etc. It is one of the challenges of being human and living as citizens of the world. Jesus's peace is completely different. He tells us this plainly, *"Not as the world gives do I give it to you."* It is a peace of the soul; an inner peace which we cannot achieve without God's presence in our lives and hearts. Christ reassures us, *"Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."*

When we have a peaceful day, it is a welcome blessing, but not a lasting peace. Jesus promises so much more — an eternal peace and the presence of the Holy Spirit to help us achieve it. As missionary disciples, let us work toward creating moments of peace with one another and in our world, while also nurturing an inner peace and serenity that can only come from the Lord.

Ministry of Prayer Connects Parish

Have you ever noticed the small, wooden boxes on the back pew in the church and on the ledge in the parish center atrium and wonder what they are for?

They are prayer petition boxes, which are there for all parishioners to place special prayers in that they would like God to answer. There are paper and pencils next to each box for your use. Please know that only first names of those being prayed for are used in order to protect their anonymity. Members of our Ministry of Prayer feel blessed to add their voices to your own petitions.

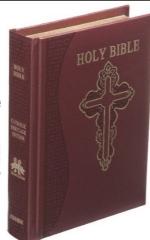
