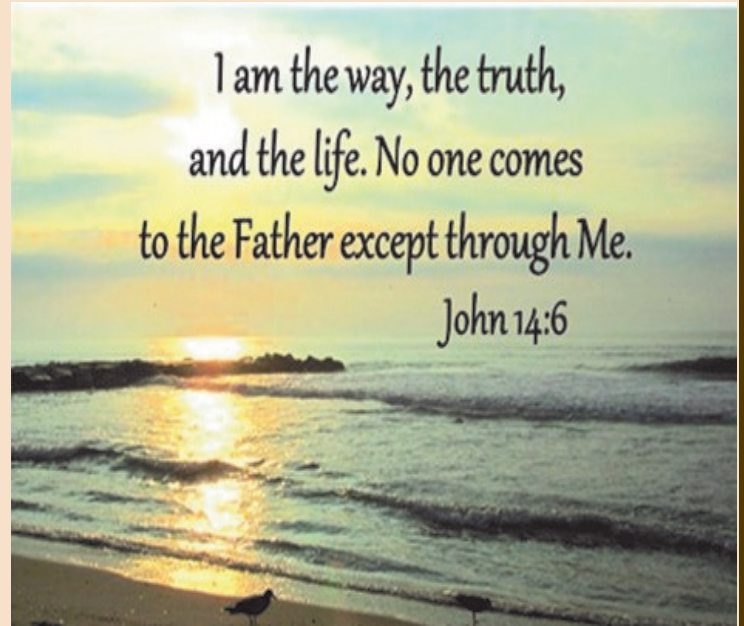

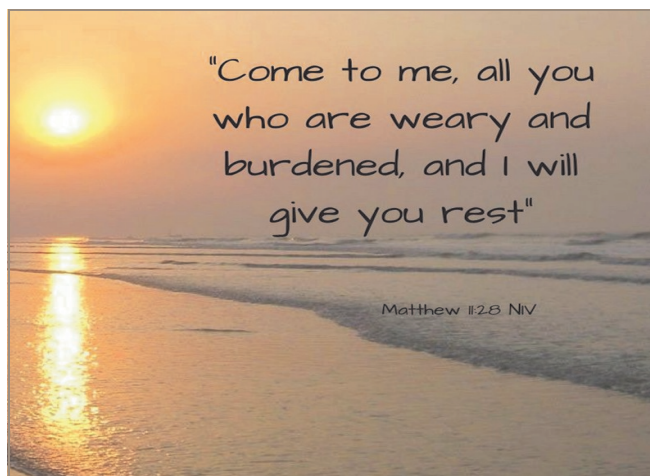

Uniting As a Spiritual Family in May 2020

Let us join together in prayer with our Holy Mother Mary!



Since the 13th century, the Catholic Church has dedicated the month of May to the Blessed Virgin Mary. In honor of our Blessed Mother, we invite you to unite spiritually with our parish community by praying the Rosary each day from **Monday, May 4th to Tuesday, May 12th as a novena**, leading up to the Feast of Our Lady of Fátima on May 13th, asking Our Lady's intercession for your personal intentions, the Church and the world.

The Apparitions in Fátima:

From May to October 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children on the 13th day of each month in Fátima, Portugal; Francisco and Jacinta Marto, who are now canonized saints, and Lúcia dos Santos. *"I am the Lady of the Rosary. Continue to pray the rosary every day."* – Our Lady to the Fátima visionaries (October 13, 1917). She urged the children to pray the Rosary daily for peace in the world; to become holy by their works in order to save souls. Our Lady's messages were meant for the people of that time, and they're still meant for us today.

Virgin Mary, turn your merciful eyes towards us amid this coronavirus pandemic. Be close to those who are concerned for their loved ones who are sick and who, in order to prevent the spread of the disease, cannot be close to them. Fill with hope those who are troubled by the uncertainty of the future and the consequences for the economy and employment.

Mother of God and our Mother, pray for us to God, the Father of mercies, that this great suffering may end and that hope and peace may dawn anew. Plead with your divine Son, as you did at Cana, so that the families of the sick and the victims be comforted, and their hearts be opened to confidence and trust.

Protect those doctors, nurses, health workers and volunteers who are on the frontline of this emergency, and are risking their lives to save others. Support their heroic effort and grant them strength, generosity and continued health.

Be close to those who assist the sick night and day, and to priests who, in their pastoral concern and fidelity to the Gospel, are trying to help and support everyone.

Blessed Virgin, illumine the minds of men and women engaged in scientific research, that they may find effective solutions to overcome this virus.

Support national leaders, that with wisdom, solicitude and generosity they may come to the aid of those lacking the basic necessities of life and may devise social and economic solutions inspired by farsightedness and solidarity.

Mary Most Holy, stir our consciences, so that the enormous funds invested in developing and stockpiling arms will instead be spent on promoting effective research on how to prevent similar tragedies from occurring in the future.

Beloved Mother, help us realize that we are all members of one great family and to recognize the bond that unites us, so that, in a spirit of fraternity and solidarity, we can help to alleviate countless situations of poverty and need. Make us strong in faith, persevering in service, constant in prayer.

Mary, Consolation of the afflicted, embrace all your children in distress and pray that God will stretch out his all-powerful hand and free us from this terrible pandemic, so that life can serenely resume its normal course.

To you, who shine on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope, do we entrust ourselves, O Clement, O Loving, O Sweet Virgin Mary. Amen.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

God's granting special grace by removing all effects of previous sin to those who turn to God in their time of need. If the intention in your heart is to be reconciled to God and to your neighbor, then your sins are forgiven along with any remaining negative effects from the sin.

How does that work?

Normally we would gather at Mass and for other forms of prayer and devotions, but because of the COVID-19 pandemic and the necessary social distancing, we are unable to. We can however still unite spiritually through our individual practices as well as shared virtual experiences. This could include uniting "through the media to the celebration of Holy Mass, the recitation of the Holy Rosary, to the practice of the Way of the Cross or other forms of devotion, or we can recite the Creed, the Lord's Prayer or invoke the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Mary, and offer this time of suffering in a spirit of faith in God and charity towards our brothers and sisters, along with the will to fulfill the usual conditions (meaning to celebrate the sacrament of Confession, and receive Holy Communion as soon as possible)". Through these actions and intentions we will be granted Plenary Indulgence.

No Matter What...

For those who are too sick to pray, even those who may have only ever said just "a few prayers," God's Mercy and Love is already with them, especially during their time of suffering. And, should it be their time to leave this life, as we know it, God will embrace them and bring them to everlasting life. We know this because **God's love is unconditional**. God sees into our hearts and knows, before we even say a prayer, who we are. God's love and forgiveness, God's salvation for all humans is an unmerited, gracious and generous, free gift.

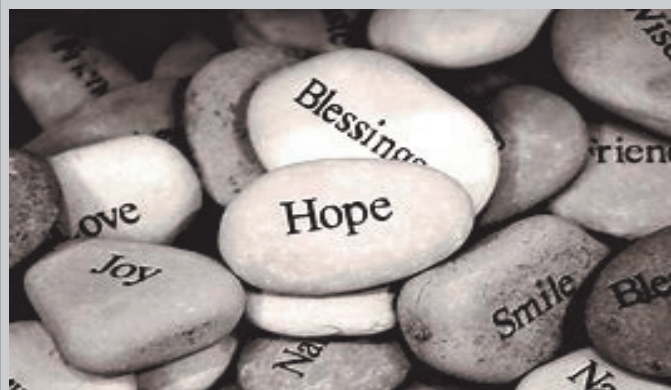

20 CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL

DIOCESE OF ROCKVILLE CENTRE

Bishop Barres in his letter last week which was emailed out to the parish, wrote of the importance of this year's Catholic Ministries Appeal in light of the COVID-19 pandemic stating, "The Catholic Ministries Appeal is an opportunity to support the ministries that help us as we build up the Body of Christ." He goes on to cite the newly expanded role of Catholic Charities in providing homecare services, Meals-On-Wheels and shopping services to those most vulnerable.

Many of you already know that each year the Diocese asks the parishes to aid in the support of the Catholic Ministries Appeal. This year our expected parish goal is \$68,200. We have just received an update from the Diocese which said that we have reached \$38,310 in pledges, or 56.17% of our goal.

If you are in a place where you are considering making a donation to an outside social services organization at this time, please keep the Catholic Ministries Appeal in mind. 100% of all monies raised is restricted to the ministries of the Appeal, and **all funds raised between 80% - 100% of a parish's goal are returned to the parish for their own programs, services and special needs. When a parish exceeds 100% of its goal, the parish receives 80% of any funds raised over the goal — certainly a welcome benefit in these times!**

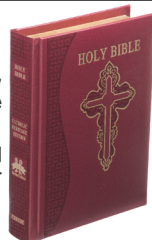
