



Jesus' Divine Mercy

Dear Father Suglia,

I want to thank you for the honor of allowing me to donate and dedicate the Divine Mercy painting to St. Sylvester's Church on behalf of the Pagano family, in loving memory of my wife, Elizabeth. I feel compelled to write you this letter because although I am truly grateful, I want this painting to become a symbol and message of Jesus' Divine Mercy Chaplet and to share its message and meaning with all our faithful parishioners of St. Sylvester's Church, and anyone who may gaze upon it that may not be aware of the graces it represents.

Our Lord's Message that I want to share — In 1935, St. Faustina received a vision of an angel sent by God to chastise a certain city. She began to pray for mercy, but her prayers were powerless. Suddenly she saw the Holy Trinity and felt the power of Jesus' grace within her. At the same time she found herself pleading with God for mercy with words she heard interiorly:



- Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us.

As she continued saying this inspired prayer, the angel became helpless and could not carry out the deserved punishment. The next day, as she was entering the chapel, she again heard this interior voice, instructing her how to recite the prayer that our Lord later called "the Chaplet." This time, after the phrase "have mercy on us" Jesus instructed her to add the words "and on the whole world." From then on, she recited this form of prayer almost constantly, offering it especially for the dying.

The Lord made it clear that the Chaplet was not just for her, but for the whole world. He also attached extraordinary promises to its recitation.

"Jesus said - Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation.

Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this Chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy. Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will."

Our Lord also appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her: "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish." O blood and water which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a fount of Mercy for us, I Trust In You! - This is what is represented on the painting which Jesus had instructed St. Faustina to have painted, now hanging in our church.

My friends, aren't we all sinful people — and we absolutely do not deserve the goodness and love our Father shows us — but each and every time we stray, He relentlessly calls us back to Him and shows us incomprehensible grace and mercy. When we understand the wildness of God's never-ending mercy, we will be compelled to live it out in our own lives. All of us should be showing mercy as well, especially during these times of uncertainty and chaos. So the next time someone you know strays and messes up, don't correct them or make them feel bad about it; show them a little glimpse of the mercy God shows us every day. Don't ration your mercy; give it away freely just as our Father abundantly gives it to us.

I hope all of us will look upon this painting with great comfort and humility in what it represents; this painting is truly God's gift to all of us.

As we continue to navigate through this challenging time, we are pleased to be able to say that things are beginning to open up here at the parish, although in a limited way. We are happy to communicate the following:

WEEKEND MASSES ARE CELEBRATED AT 5PM ON SATURDAYS

AND 9AM AND 11AM ON SUNDAYS. You must register to attend these Masses weekly through our parish website beginning each Wednesday morning at 9am. The program will stop accepting reservations on Friday at 3pm (or sooner if it reaches a maximum of 80 people for that particular Mass). Ushers will check your registrations at the door before entering the church and will seat you. The pews in the church are marked off to maintain social distancing.

WEEKEND MASSES WILL NOW BE LIVE STREAMED ON YOUTUBE AT 5PM AND 11AM —LINK AVAILABLE FROM OUR

WEBSITE. If you click on the Mass and it has already begun, you will have the ability on *YouTube* to rewind the Mass to the beginning while it is in progress. Don't worry if you are unable to rewind — the Mass in its entirety will also be available immediately after its conclusion. Live streaming will allow you to attend Mass at home simultaneously with your fellow parishioners in the church, and with much clearer video and sound than we have been able to offer in the past.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION IS OFFERED ON SATURDAYS AT 4PM IN THE CHURCH. Unfortunately due to limited seating, you cannot remain for the 5pm Mass after Reconciliation if you have not reserved a seat ahead of time.

WEEKDAY MORNING MASSES ARE CELEBRATED ON MONDAYS, TUESDAYS, THURSDAYS AND FRIDAYS AT 8:30AM IN THE CHURCH. You do not need to register for these Masses.

THE PARISH OFFICE IS NOW OPEN ON MONDAYS, WEDNESDAYS AND FRIDAYS FROM 9AM TO 12PM TO ASSIST YOU WITH MASS CARDS, ANNOUNCED MASSES, MEMORIALS, SACRAMENT CERTIFICATES, ETC.

As we continue to navigate the public celebration of Mass within State Guidelines, St. Sylvester Parish will offer Mass on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM & 11AM. Please note the following important information:

- At this time, the bishop still dispenses all the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.
- Our Sunday worship will be livestreamed on Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 11am and will continue to be posted on the website for those who are vulnerable, for those who have a health impairment that would make them more susceptible to serious illness, for those who might not be feeling well, or have a fever, and for those who are caretakers for other people who are vulnerable. If you are in any of these situations, you are encouraged to continue to remain at home and worship online.
- Restrooms will be open for emergency use only! Please use bathroom at home!
- There is a mandatory online reservation system for all who wish to attend Mass. Please register beginning Wednesdays at 9am by going to www.stsylvesterli.org
- Please print out your registration information or have available on your phone as you will be asked to show your registration before entering the church.
- Masks or other face coverings must be worn by all participants.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass so your reservation may be confirmed and you may be shown to your seat. Capacity at this time is limited to 25%.
- Seating will be done according to social distancing guidelines. You will most likely not be sitting in your "usual" seat. Families may sit together at Mass. There is no "saving seats" or asking to be seated in a particular seat.
- The Offertory procession and passing of the donation basket will be omitted.
- If you wish to make a contribution, there will be baskets at the entrance and exit. Contributions may also dropped at the parish center or made online.
- The Sign of Peace or other greetings will not be exchanged.
- Directions will be given for Communion, which will be distributed after Mass as you are leaving the church. Please follow the directions of the ushers.
- Please go directly to your car, as no congregating is permitted.
- We will continue to keep you updated on changes as we move forward.

This is a work in progress, so as we move forward there may be changes. We appreciate your patience and want you to know that our first priority is that those attending Mass will be safe.

Revised & Simplified Faith Formation Program 2020-2021!

Dear Parents/Guardians and Catechists,

We have revised and simplified the St. Sylvester Faith Formation Program so that it will be more manageable and yet still meaningful for all involved, Catechists, students, and their families.

As school districts are moving forward with plans for the school year, it has become clear to us that parents and students may be challenged by the newness of what lies ahead. This combined with parents changing work situations has caused us to take another look at the Faith Formation Program we are offering and how we can be more accommodating to all.

If you have already registered your child, we hope this will make life a little easier. If you have not yet registered your child, the hope here is that with this more accommodating schedule, you will now reconsider registering them.

Here is the revised and simplified Faith Formation Program for 2020-2021 Year for Levels 1 through 7!

- Arrangements will be made for a curbside pickup of the materials (books, calendar, etc.) needed for each of your children so they can work from home.
- ♦ There will be 4 virtual meetings on the Zoom platform, for the year, that we ask students to try their best to attend (with the help of a parent). So, for example, if you registered your child for a Level 5 class on Mondays at 4:30 p.m., your child's class will be held four (4) times virtually on 4 specific Mondays at 4:30 p.m. according to the Level 5 Calendar. If you registered your child for Level 3, 4 or 5 Home Taught the virtual; meetings will be held on Saturdays according to the Home Taught Level 3, 4 or 5 calendars. Level 1 will be Home Taught and have four (4) virtual meetings on specific Saturdays according to the Level 1 calendar.
- ♦ The calendar will not begin until Monday, November 30, 2020 to give everyone time to adjust to the school schedules, etc. and will end in May.
- ♦ Parents with children who have special needs!

 Parents, for students who are in the Individualized Faith Formation Program or whose needs would make it difficult to stay focused virtually, we will work directly and individually with you to accommodate your child's needs. Please go ahead and register your child for the next Level in the Individualized Faith Formation Program. If you have questions, please email faithformation@stsylvesterli.org

Stewardship of Treasure — Generosity, Gratitude and Funding the Mission

Today Jesus gives us the parable of the talents, in which different amounts are given by the master to the servants with an expectation that they will invest them somehow and return them with a profit. I always felt badly for the servant who, consumed by fear of losing his one talent and angering the master, simply buried it in a hole in the ground. He took the sure bet, as many of us do at times; but that is not what God wants from us. God wants us to recognize, expand, develop and grow all of the gifts He has given us, including our money and our talents, not for personal gain, but in gratitude to serve others and continue to build His Kingdom here in Medford and throughout the world.

Look, I understand that nobody wants to talk about money (especially this year), but if we are trying to live a Stewardship way of life we must understand that everything we have is given to us by God, including our money or "treasure." Generosity and gratitude are the hallmarks of true Stewardship. To live life as a steward there must be a realization somewhere along the way that we don't just have to be generous, we get to be generous. We are each called at our Baptism to a life of Christian action and the proper use of our treasure is part of that. As someone said in a webinar I recently attended, we are born generous, but then forget over time how to be generous.



Joyful giving is an opportunity to show gratitude to God for our blessings and to care for and love one another. Our time and our talents are extremely important in how we show gratitude, but so is how we use our treasure. Money and possessions are spoken about hun-

dreds of times in the Bible — it is important as Christians to look at how we view and spend our money. Do we give enough to fund God's mission adequately according to what we have been given, or does Dunkin' Donuts get more from us than we donate to the church?

There is so much pressure in our society to do what others do— but we are instead called to be disciples.

The late Bishop McGann, in his letter which introduced Stewardship as a "Way of Life" to the Diocese of Rockville Centre over 24 years ago, echoed the words of the USCCB in saying, "The life of a Christian steward models the life of Jesus. It is challenging and even difficult, in many respects, yet intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian stewards." He continues with the question, "Do we also wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ and Christian stewards of our world and our Church?"

Usually at this time of year I send out a letter to the parish along with a commitment card asking that you prayerfully consider your financial Stewardship —the amount you are giving to the parish and other charities. As many are experiencing job losses, illness and other life upheavals and uncertainties right now, we do not feel it is an appropriate time for us to ask you to formally commit to an increase in your financial giving. I will ask you though to prayerfully reflect on what you spend your God-given financial blessings on each week and to give what you can generously and joyfully to further Jesus' mission here on earth. I also encourage you to increase your time spent in prayer — in particular to pray for all those who are struggling in so many ways due to the pandemic and for those unable to provide the basic necessities for their families at this difficult time in our history.

I will close with the reassuring final words of Bishop McGann's Stewardship letter, "I remind each of you that you are not in this alone. We travel together as pilgrims in this life. Let us encourage each other to stand firm and take heart for God promised to be with us always. The Spirit will show us the way."

May God continue to lead us forward as faithfilled stewards in courage, compassion and love for the Trinity and one another. ~ Lori Zito

We are called to bring the best of ourselves and our faith to the public square—and yet today, many shy away from such involvement because our national and local conversations are filled with vitriol and harsh language, often directed at people themselves.

When personal attacks replace honest debate, no one wins. This kind of attack, no matter the reason, only serves to further divide our communities. As Catholics, we must model a better way. We invite you to join the Civilize It campaign by taking the pledge below as a way to promote civility, love our neighbors, and build community.

Civilize It is about making room in your heart for those with whom you disagree. We are called to recognize that each one of us is a beloved child of God and to respond in love to that reality. Twenty Five Positive Activities During The Holidays® Grief Care Fellowship®

Keep yourself in the Word of God for comfort and encouragement

Maintain your daily quiet time - allow the Lord to minister to you

Plan to attend some church holiday musicals and special programs

Keep a journal of "special blessings" during the holidays from the Lord

For a special blessing write out something you are thankful for every day

Planning your holiday season will assist in reducing your level of stress. Having some plan is better than no plan at all. You cannot ignore the holidays; they are just as real as your grief and they are going to happen. You cannot wish them away, you cannot sleep them away and you cannot ignore them. The following is a brief overview of some of the thoughts we shared in our "Grieving Through The Holiday Seminar."

First and foremost Christmas is a reminder of our Lord's love and grace

Make time to attend spiritual holiday activities

Maintain a journal of God's blessings at this season

Realize your holidays will never be the same, they will be difficult

Expect your emotional grief to become more amplified at this time

It is okay to feel sad and miss your loved one

Decide ahead of time where to spend the holidays, have a plan

Communicate ahead of time with family/friends you plan to be with

Remember that other family and friends may be grieving also

Be honest in telling others what you do or do not want to do

Allow others to minister to you - and you to them

Remember that it is okay to seek professional counseling

Journal your holiday thoughts, ideas, wishes and events

Don't feel guilty if you feel like you need to leave a festivity

Have some form of plan so if need be you can excuse yourself from the activity

Be sensitive to your own feelings of "holiday overload", eliminate some activities

Do not allow others to tell you how to spend your holidays

Determine what traditions you want to keep, what to change, develop new traditions

The holidays can be hectic, especially in your grief, allow yourself "quiet times"


