As we continue to navigate through this challenging time, we are pleased to be able to say that things are beginning to open up here at the parish, although in a limited way. We are happy to communicate the following:

WEEKEND MASSES ARE CELEBRATED AT 5PM ON SATURDAYS AND 9AM AND 11AM ON SUNDAYS. You must register to attend these Masses weekly through our parish website beginning each <u>Wednesday morning at 9am</u>. The program will stop accepting reservations on <u>Friday at 3pm</u> (or sooner if it reaches a maximum of 80 people for that particular Mass). Ushers will check your registrations at the door before entering the church and will seat you. The pews in the church are marked off to maintain social distancing.

### WEEKEND MASSES WILL NOW BE LIVE STREAMED ON YOUTUBE AT <u>5PM</u> AND <u>11AM</u> —LINK AVAILABLE FROM OUR

**WEBSITE.** If you click on the Mass and it has already begun, you will have the ability on *YouTube* to rewind the Mass to the beginning while it is in progress. Don't worry if you are unable to rewind — the Mass in its entirety will also be available immediately after its conclusion. Live streaming will allow you to attend Mass at home simultaneously with your fellow parishioners in the church, and with much clearer video and sound than we have been able to offer in the past.

**THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION IS OFFERED ON SATUR-DAYS AT 4PM IN THE CHURCH.** Unfortunately due to limited seating, you cannot remain for the 5pm Mass after Reconciliation if you have not reserved a seat ahead of time.

WEEKDAY MORNING MASSES ARE CELEBRATED ON MONDAYS, TUESDAYS, THURSDAYS AND FRIDAYS AT 8:30AM IN THE CHURCH. You <u>do not</u> need to register for these Masses.

THE PARISH OFFICE IS NOW OPEN ON MONDAYS, WEDNESDAYS AND FRIDAYS FROM 9AM TO 12PM TO ASSIST YOU WITH MASS CARDS, ANNOUNCED MASSES, MEMORIALS, SACRAMENT CERTIFICATES, ETC.

### **Dear Parishioners**,

As we continue to navigate the public celebration of Mass within State Guidelines, St. Sylvester Parish will offer Mass on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM & 11AM.

Please note the following important information:

- At this time, the bishop still dispenses all the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.
- Our Sunday worship will be livestreamed on Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 11am and will continue to be posted on the website for those who are vulnerable, for those who have a health impairment that would make them more susceptible to serious illness, for those who might not be feeling well, or have a fever, and for those who are caretakers for other people who are vulnerable. If you are in any of these situations, you are encouraged to continue to remain at home and worship online.
- Restrooms will be open for emergency use only! Please use bathroom at home!
- There is a mandatory online reservation system for all who wish to attend Mass. Please register beginning Wednesdays at 9am by going to www.stsylvesterli.org
- Please print out your registration information or have available on your phone as you will be asked to show your registration before entering the church.
- Masks or other face coverings must be worn by all participants.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass so your reservation may be confirmed and you may be shown to your seat. Capacity at this time is limited to 25%.
- Seating will be done according to social distancing guidelines. You will most likely not be sitting in your "usual" seat. Families may sit together at Mass. There is no "saving seats" or asking to be seated in a particular seat.
- The Offertory Procession and passing of the donation basket will be omitted.
- If you wish to make a contribution, there will be baskets at the entrance and exit. Contributions may also dropped at the parish center or made online.
- The Sign of Peace or other greetings will not be exchanged.
- Directions will be given for Communion, which will be distributed after Mass as you are leaving the church. Please follow the directions of the ushers.
- Please go directly to your car, as no congregating is permitted.
- We will continue to keep you updated on changes as we move forward.

This is a work in progress, so as we move forward there may be changes. We appreciate your patience and want you to know that our first priority is that those attending Mass will be safe.

### **RCIA Celebrates** The Rite of Election

Last Sunday, Justin, Stefan and Dennis, who have been meeting virtually every week for more than a year with the RCIA Team reflecting on the Sunday readings and teachings of the Church, celebrated the Rite of Election which marks the beginning of the period of final, more intense preparation in their journey to the Easter Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist).

In October of last year, they celebrated the



Rite of Acceptance into the Catechumenate, and made public their desire to become Catholic. And we, the Church, this community, carried out our apostolic mission, and accepted them and prayed for them as persons who intend to become members of the Church.

At the Rite of Election they reaffirmed their intention to become Catholic; their Godparents, catechists and RCIA Team gave testimony to their readiness and we the community, the Church, expressed our approval and pledged to support them in faith, prayer, and example. Lent is not just a time to fast, pray and give alms, it is a time to reflect more deeply on our own Baptism and what that means, how we live it out in our day-to-day life. So, as we journey with and pray for Justin, Stefan and Dennis, may the meaning and understanding of our own Baptism be illuminated and prepare us to celebrate more fully the Easter Mysteries!

**Finding Lights in the Darkness** 

We hear in Mark's Gospel today that Jesus takes Peter, James and John up on a high mountain and reveals His divinity to them, becoming enveloped in a dazzling, white light alongside Moses and Elijah.

Peter first speaks to Jesus saying, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here!" and then suggests build-ing tents in homage to the three figures. Next, the three apostles hear God's voice come from the clouds, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him." So clearly, Peter, although 'terrified', understood that something extraordinary had just occurred — he and the others had just been given a glimpse of Jesus' divinity! And yet, we know that despite witnessing all of this and having great faith, Peter still denies knowing Christ three times before He is crucified.

As Christian stewards, I would like to think that we too have great faith in Jesus and His message of love, forgiveness, compassion and healing. However, just like Peter, we are human and don't always have the courage to publicly stand up for what is right, preferring to remain in the background. Why? Probably because, like Peter, we are afraid of repercussions and don't want to be left out or ostracized for our beliefs.

The good news is that despite Peter's weaknesses, Christ still loves him and forgives him. Perhaps this Lent, in this terribly difficult and dark time in the history of our nation and the world, we need to focus even more on God's love, forgiveness and compassion for each and every one of us. When we interact with other people throughout the day, do they see the face and hands of Christ at work? Do we see the Light of *Christ in them*? If not, why not? During this time of reflection and renewal, let's not be afraid to challenge ourselves and ask the hard questions.

And through all of this Lenten preparation let's not forget, as Saint Paul says in his Letter to the Romans, "Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us?" ~ Lori Zito
