

Five Elements of Financial Stewardship

1) Planned:

The decision to give is just that – a decision. It requires prayer, reflection, thought and time, so that it isintegrated with other financial decisions as part of a careful, intentional response to God's generosity.

2) Proportionate:

Our giving is proportionate to what God has given us. Our response to God's generosity in our lives should be proportionate to what we have received from God.

The "right" portion should be an expression of our gratitude to God for God's generosity in our lives. Some people have chosen to use the biblical tithe (10%) as a goal for their giving in a particular year. Others have chosen to give an hour's wages for each employed person in the family. Some people come up with other ways. Whatever method you choose to determine how much you will give as part of your financial stewardship plan, always do it as part of your prayer and reflection, and consider two things:

- a. Give half of what you decide to the parish and the other half to other charities and organizations.
- b. Take-a-Step to the next level of giving if it is possible this year.

3) From Our Substance:

The proportion of our gift becomes sacrificial when it comes from our substance rather than our abundance. When we give out of our substance, we are changed in the process.

After prayerful contemplation, I/we commit to

4) A Prayer of Thanksgiving:

Our gifts are most appropriately presented at the Offertory of the Mass. The Eucharist is about thanksgiving, and it is a perfect way to demonstrate a grateful response to the unfathomable love God has shown us.

Too often, we want to separate the issue of giving money from what we may perceive are more "spiritual" aspects of our faith life. Yet, the commitment to share our financial resources is of the most important expressions of what our faith means to us.

Offering our gifts at Mass places them in an appropriate context of prayer, praise, sacrifice, and thanksgiving. We can express our joy in having received and in being able to give. We give a portion of the tremendous gifts that have been given to us-the most important of which we celebrate at the Eucharist. There is no better time, then, to fulfill our commitment to the stewardship of financial resources.

5) A Gift:

No gift is truly a gift unless it is given freely without reservation or condition. The gifts of God are given to us in just such an unconditional manner, and we are called to model our giving after God's.

Stewardship doesn't buy anything. It doesn't buy happiness or love or a tenfold return on our investment. It doesn't buy heaven. The motive for giving is not the expectation of getting something back.

We are able to give what we give because God has already given to us. Stewardship is really a response, then, to the generosity of God and to our call as baptized Christians.

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

Children's Liturgy of the Word is when right after the opening prayer, but before the readings, children are called up by the priest and accompanied by Catechists to the Worship Room in the Parish Center. There, they hear and reflect on the readings at an age appropriate level, sing the Responsorial Psalm, the Gospel Acclamation and recite a simple Creed before returning to the church to join the rest of the community for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This will take approximately 20 minutes. During this time the adults and everyone else in the church will be hearing the readings as they usually do.

How can my child participate in the Children's Liturgy of the Word?

When you come to the 11:00 AM Mass on the Sundays listed above, follow the directions of the priest when he calls the children forward to be sent to the Worship Room in the Parish Center. Any child in Level 1 or above is invited to participate. If your child has special needs or is shy, please feel free to accompany your child to the Worship Room.



The Children's Choir is open to all students in grades 2-8 in the parish. No audition is required, only enthusiasm for singing is needed. We will be singing the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month during the Children's Liturgy of the Word. The Children's Choir (and the children involved in the Children's Liturgy of the Word) will also sing when we rejoin the full assembly for the remainder of Mass back in the church.

How the Diocese of Rockville Centre Has Been Addressing Child Protection and the Clergy Abuse Scandal



The sexual abuse of minors is a horrifying sin and a crisis in our society at large. Even one instance of the abuse of a child by a member of the clergy is far too many. However, it is a **myth** that the abuse crisis only exists in the Catholic Church. It is also a **myth** that the Church has done nothing to address this problem.

This does not diminish the shame of what occurred in the Church in the past. But, if we fail to see and deal with the reality of the sexual abuse of minors across all levels of society: in schools, hospitals, institutions, all religious and secular organizations, and especially in families, then we will fail in our duty to truly protect all children.

What does the Diocese do to protect children?

- All accusations of abuse (whether credible or not) made against any
 member of the clergy, employee or volunteer, are promptly reported to the
 district attorney's office, regardless of when the abuse may have occurred.
 This policy has been in place since 2003 in the Diocese of Rockville
 Centre.
- The diocese has released the names of all clergy, employees and volunteers that we are aware of having ever been accused of the sexual abuse of a minor (whether credible or not) to the proper law enforcement authorities.
- All priests, deacons, diocesan and parish employees, and volunteers are background screened.
- All priests, deacons, diocesan and parish employees and volunteers are required to attend the VIRTUS course: Protecting God's Children. Offered in multiple languages, these classes are designed to educate everyone in the Church on the prevention of child sexual abuse, making participants aware of the signs of abuse, the methods used by offenders to commit abuse, and steps used to prevent such abuse.
- Children attending parish faith formation programs are taught safety awareness through the program: Think First & Stay Safe: Child Lures Prevention. Youth enrolled in diocesan elementary and high schools receive safety awareness training beginning with nursery school and continuing throughout high school.
- Rigorous psychological screening is done for all men discerning vocations to the priesthood, and this continues throughout the five-year period of seminary formation. In addition, all seminarians receive training in diocesan child protection policies.
- Codes of Conduct have been published and mandated for all clergy, employees, volunteers and youth, to clearly define what is and what is not acceptable when interacting with children and young adults.
- In 2003, the Diocese of Rockville Centre established an Office for the Protection of Children and Young People. This Office works collaboratively with other Diocesan offices to ensure the safety and wellbeing of children, youth and vulnerable adults.
- A longstanding Diocesan Review Board (DRB), comprised mostly of lay men and women with expertise in the fields of psychiatry, law enforcement, jurisprudence, psychology and expertise in sexual abuse of minors/child protection, functions as a consultative body advising the Bishop. The DRB helps in the assessment of reports of sexual abuse of minors and advises the Bishop in the determination of the cleric's suitability for ministry.
- Since the inception of audit reviews in 2003, the Diocese has participated in 14 audits and found to be in compliance with standards as outlined in the Charter for the Protection of Children & Young People for each audit period.

What does the Diocese do for victim survivors of child sexual abuse?

 The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People has a three-fold mission:

> To promote healing and reconciliation with the victim/ survivors of sexual abuse of minors

To ensure the protection of the faithful for the future

To ensure the accountability of our procedures

- We have a dedicated phone line for reporting abuse (516)594-9063.
 All allegations are responded to within 24 hours of the report.
 Outreach to the victim survivor is initiated, counseling assistance is offered to survivors and, when appropriate, to family members; and a determination is made regarding the necessity of additional support services.
- The Diocesan Victims' Assistance Coordinator is available for the immediate pastoral care of persons who report having been sexually abused as a minor by anyone working for the Church.
- In 2017, the Diocese of Rockville Centre initiated the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) to offer an opportunity for some measure of healing and justice to those who were abused by diocesan clergy. The IRCP program allows survivors of clergy sexual abuse to file confidential claims and receive financial compensation. It continues to offer survivors a confidential option for reconciliation. To date, 370 people have filed claims with our IRCP. The vast majority of claimants 277 to be exact—have accepted compensation totaling just over \$50 million, with 75 80 claims still being processed. This program is currently ongoing.

Facts:

Independent analysis by John Jay College of Criminal Justice and the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University confirm that the vast majority of reported offenses took place between the 1960's and 1980's, then declined sharply. The allegations that we have received in the Diocese of Rockville Centre follow that same pattern.

Since the year 2015, **nationwide** there have been only 17 reported cases of current clerical sexual abuse in the Catholic Church as reported by CARA. In the Diocese of Rockville Centre during that same time there have been zero reports of a current incident of clergy sexual abuse. This shows that the efforts of the Catholic Church for many years now throughout the country, and in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, have been working.

The Work that Must Continue

The work of the Church – of administering the Sacraments, of preaching the Gospel, teaching, healing, advocating, serving, and ministering to the poor and vulnerable – can and must continue, despite the sins of the past.

The months and years ahead of us will require perseverance and prayer if we are to emerge as a Church even more dedicated to Christ's saving mission. We are reminded to turn to Mary our Mother and draw courage from the one who did not look away from her suffering Son. She waited patiently, suffered with him, and shared in his victory over sin and death.

This is the same Mary who, as Mother of the Church, gathered with the Apostles in the locked room, waiting for the power of the Holy Spirit to descend at Pentecost. As we enter a time of Paschal Mystery suffering, may Mary guide us, so that together we may continue to carry out the mission of her Son: the building up of the Kingdom of God throughout Long Island and the world.
