

## Pastor's Column SS Medford 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Virtue, Continued

September 1, 2019

In the past weeks, we spoke of the first two of the Cardinal Virtues: Prudence and Temperance. Prudence is to think before we act and Temperance is to conduct ourselves moderately (not "overdoing" it).

This week we will cover the last two Cardinal Virtues: Justice and Fortitude.

Why is virtue so important? Because goodness is something that has to be desired so that we can grow in grace and holiness.

The four Cardinal Virtues progress from one to the other as necessary building blocks. We must be prudent to be temperate; we must be prudent and temperate to live justly.

Justice goes beyond our simplest definition and mirrors the supernatural. For example, "Gandhi went on a hunger strike to fight the injustice of India's colonial oppressors." Justice is supernatural in that it is what we want for all: peace, a living wage, an adequate supply of food, and the ability to be educated. This is not an exhaustive list, but some of the qualities of the virtue of Justice

Fortitude, building upon Prudence, Temperance, and Justice can also be called supernatural. Fortitude is seen in the examples of the "witness" of martyrdom. The patroness of our Diocese, Saint Agnes, was a 3rd Century martyr. She would have been forced to renounce Christianity by accepting marriage to a rich man of noble descent who was a Pagan. Rather than abandon her faith and our belief that Jesus indeed rose from the dead, she chose death.

Tertullian, a second-century Roman lawyer who also wrote and spoke as a theologian, gives us a high expression about early Christianity and martyrdom. He said, "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of Christianity."

We would not be here except for the martyrs' sacrifice, which inspired by the Holy Spirit, guarantees divine vocation to Christianity. That is, our being persons for others, with our sights set on sainthood and eternity.

From Luke's Gospel this week:

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

Is there any better way to express virtue than to take care of the poor materially? I am not just talking about dropping money in the poor box, which is virtuous in itself. Instead, we should ensure their needs are met by going the extra mile.

I think that is what Jesus is challenging us to in our Gospel. Yes, it can be a daunting challenge. However, when we are people of virtue, it becomes more transparent and less intimidating.




