# Pastor's Column SS Medford 23nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Following is reprinted from September 13, 2013 from Saint Aidan's in Williston Park. The author is Msgr. James McDonald who passed away last year. He was a great teacher and mentor and here is a great exposition on the importance of parent's teaching their children about God and the Eucharist. Fr. DAS

#### THE WISE FATHER

September 8, 2019

It happened right here at St. Aidan's this past Sunday at the evening Mass. I was distributing Holy Communion at the cut in the center aisle. A young man with his son in his arms came up to receive. The little boy was about three and just before he received his father said to him: "That's Jesus." Was I impressed! For one thing the father was at Mass and for another he took the opportunity to teach a point of faith to his child. Now you might say that the little boy really didn't understand too much. Nevertheless, at a very early age he was learning that his father went to church and I imagine there is some conversation at home about God. That father is doing a fantastic job. There are a lot of other people like that in our parish. If you have a good memory, you might recall the woman who was going over the Mass readings with her child before Mass. People like this understand that parents are the first teachers of religion to their children. I am so happy when I see parents with their young kids at Mass and every so often I thank the parents for being such good Catholics.

The center of the Catholic faith is the Sacrifice of the Mass and the Holy Eucharist. We know that the Mass is no mere ceremony or ritual. Rather it is the actual renewal of the Death and Resurrection of Christ taking place in our midst. The truth is whenever we are at Mass we are actually at Calvary and the great reality is that we actually receive the very Body and Blood of Jesus Christ at communion. I have often felt (and the conviction grows stronger all the time) that the Dogma of the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist needs to be constantly taught, explained and emphasized with enthusiasm.

In recent years there have been surveys that indicated that any number of Catholics have very deficient views or beliefs about the Holy Eucharist. Some of these surveys have told us that many have the idea that the Eucharist is merely a symbol of Christ but is not Christ Himself. This, of course, would be absolutely false and contrary to the faith of the Church through the centuries. The Catholic Church solemnly teaches that Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal Son of God, is really, truly and substantially present in the

Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. This was made especially clear at the Council of Trent which was held after the Protestant Reformation (1545-1563.) The Catholic Church wanted there to be no doubt about the reality of Christ's presence in the Eucharist. This was far too important and there could be no ambiguity whatsoever.

It is not surprising; however, that many people have difficulty believing in the Holy Eucharist. In St. John's Gospel, chapter 6, we read that Jesus promised the crowds who surrounded him that he would give them his flesh to eat and his blood to drink. Many could not accept this at all and left Jesus. As a matter of fact, St. John tells us that: "When many of his disciples heard it, they said, 'This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" (John 6:60.) The result of this solemn proclamation of Our Lord was that many walked away—they could not and would not believe. Jesus let them go. He would not compromise on the Eucharist. An English Jesuit (I think it was Father C.C. Martindale) wisely said: "The business of the Catholic Church is to get people to go to Mass." He hit the nail on the head! Once you start praying the Mass and receiving Holy Communion, you become more and more like Christ and grow in charity. You begin to live the Gospel more and more. That is why we have so many celebrations of Holy Mass at St. Aidan's—to give people every possible opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in His sacrifice and sacrament.

I admire that dad who told his son about Jesus last Sunday and I encourage all teachers of religion and parents and grandparents to follow his example and teach the Eucharist over and over again. It is the greatest treasure of our Catholic faith!


