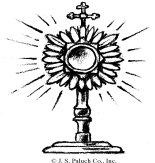

POPE CALLS US TO A FEBRUARY "FESTIVAL OF FORGIVENESS"

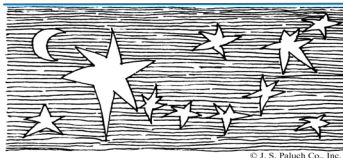
Pope Francis has described his vision of the Church as a field hospital in the middle of a terrible wounded world. The Church herself is populated by wounded and sinful members, but by God's grace she still serves as an instrument of healing and forgiving mercy.

During Lent 2015, the Church in the Archdiocese of Chicago wants to bring the medicine of mercy not only to the Catholic faithful but to anyone who stands in need of healing and forgiveness.

On Friday, February 27 and Saturday, February 28, the Church in Chicago will offer special opportunities for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance and for prayers of healing. Catholics, especially those who have been away from the sacraments, are invited to come and share in God's mercy. That second weekend of Lent, Paul's letter to the Romans will be read at every Mass. And we, the Church, will proclaim and embrace his words: "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:11)

Every human being lives with elements of brokenness. Every human soul knows its fragility. In Chicago, we are more aware than ever of the wounds inflicted on our city and its people by violence, gangs, drugs, domestic abuse, child neglect, economic injustice, and a spirit of mistrust among people of different races, cultures, languages and ways of life. The city begs for the mercy of God and for healing. And the Catholic Church in Chicago wants to be a field hospital where all people can find the medicine of God's mercy.

This focused time to encounter the mercy of God in our lives is inspired by Pope Francis who called the Church in Rome to a "Festival of Forgiveness," an annual Lenten observance to embrace God's mercy. In Chicago we will join the Holy Father and local churches throughout the world in the observance of this graced opportunity.

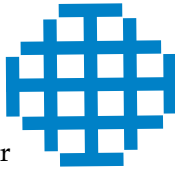

LIKE A GOOD NEIGHBOR...

Do you know your neighbors? How are they faring in the cold weather? If you know of someone elderly, or someone who lives alone, check on them... because it's the neighborly – and Gospel – thing to do. It's great to stand across a fencepost and chat when it's warm but colder weather and snow forces more people indoors.

Maybe the senior citizen next door needs milk or bread. Maybe the widower across the alley needs someone to mail his bills. It only takes a minute but can mean so much. Do you see newspapers piling up at the front door? Ring the doorbell to check on the individual.

Be a good neighbor: ring a doorbell, make a phone call, reach out to help.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

"Last rites" is a persistent but pesky phrase in the Catholic lexicon, and not a particularly useful phrase since it props open the door to misunderstanding. Many Catholics presume it refers to the anointing of the sick, yet there is nothing "last" about it. Clearly, the Church desires anointing to be celebrated fairly early on in the crisis of illness, and not as a last measure. The Rites for the Dying stand apart in the Church's plan, and include two principal rites. The first is viaticum, Latin for "food for the journey," the reception of Holy Communion by a dying person. Even very active and aware Catholics often do not realize that this "last rite" does not require a priest's presence, but can be conducted by a deacon or minister of Holy Communion.

The second "last rite" in the pastoral plan is a prayer called "Commendation of the Dying." Similarly, this does not require the presence of a priest, but can be led by any minister or family member. Too often, we have focused on what only a priest can do, namely anoint, and have forgotten the fullness of liturgical care that the Church desires for its dying faithful. The "last rites" are completely available to us even when a priest is not.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Los textos sagrados que componen lo que llamamos Biblia fueron coleccionados, organizados y ordenados durante los primeros cuatrocientos años del cristianismo. Fue durante el Concilio de Cartago (Siglo IV), que finalmente se canonizó (estableció el orden) la Biblia católica. Los textos sagrados de la Biblia se han proclamado a lo largo de los siglos en la celebración eucarística para nutrir la fe de los creyentes. En 1969, la Iglesia católica estableció un nuevo Leccionario conteniendo los textos bíblicos que se proclaman en la liturgia. El Leccionario contiene un gran número de textos de la Escritura, organizados de una manera muy especial a fin de que estos textos sean proclamados en las misas dominicales y en las feriales (entre semana). El Leccionario está organizado de tal manera que si una persona asiste a misa diariamente durante un período de tres años, escuchará casi todos los textos de la Biblia. La proclamación de los Evangelios se realiza mediante ciclos dominicales. Durante el Ciclo A, proclamamos el Evangelio de Mateo; el de Marcos durante el ciclo B y el de Lucas durante el ciclo C. El Evangelio de san Juan se proclama durante la Cuaresma y la Pascua. Así mismo, el capítulo 6 de este Evangelio se incorpora al Ciclo B, que es el de Marcos. El resto del Nuevo Testamento se proclama como segunda lectura, excepto durante la Pascua, mientras que la primera lectura se proclama siempre del Antiguo Testamento, excepto durante la Pascua. No olvidemos el Salmo, que es una respuesta a la Escritura.
