Today is **Christian Unity Sunday** part of the week long observance, January 18-25, when we celebrate what God is doing through the many ecumenical agencies—local, regional, national and international—to promote understanding and cooperation among Christians and others in our community.

A Message from Bishop Nelson Perez:

During this special week of prayer for Christian unity during which we call to mind our brothers and sisters in Christ, we take part remembering the prayer of Jesus, "That they all may be one."

This year's theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is, "They Showed Us Unusual Kindness" (Acts 28:2). This theme reminds all of us of the importance of the need for "unusual kindness" in the dialogue that leads to growth in unity. We do this in a world where separation and division hinder the quest for Christian Unity. Throughout the coming year, we are being called to show unusual kindness towards one another.

Pope Francis reminds us that tenderness and kindness are not virtues of the weak but rather a sign of strength of spirit and a capacity for concern, compassion and genuine openness to others.

As we pray together during this week of Christian Unity, we are reminded that our calling as members of the body of Christ includes Jesus' command to "to love one another as I have loved you." (John 15:12)

COLLECTION FOR EL SALVADOR & LATIN AMERICA – Next Weekend, January 25-26



El Salvador ("The Savior") is the only nation in the world to bear the name of Christ. It is approximately the same size as the state of Massachusetts and is located in Central America.

In 1964, the Diocese of Cleveland answered the call of Pope John XXIII to help spread the kingdom of Christ to the poor in El Salvador. Since that date the diocese has maintained a presence in the area, even through years of Civil War and the martyrdom of two of its missionaries in 1980: Sister Dorothy Kazel, OSU, and Miss Jean Donovan. Currently, Father Paul Schindler serves in La Libertad and Father John Ostrowski serves in Teotepeque. These parishes serve the pastoral needs of thousands of Salvadorans.

The **EL SALVADOR-LATIN AMERICAN COLLECTION** will take place on **January 25-26**. This is the only appeal made by the Diocesan Mission Office for the Cleveland Latin American Mission in El Salvador. This appeal also makes a contribution to the Collection for the Church in Latin America that is managed by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops and benefits projects and the formation of seminarians, religious and lay leaders in 23 countries across Latin America.
