LONELINESS, SEPARATION

When we are faced with bad news or a difficult situation we often want to be by ourselves, to be separated from others. It is a way of providing an opportunity to get ourselves together to deal with the situation. That is what is so telling from the opening verses of the Gospel for this 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. It says that Jesus hears of the death of John the Baptist and withdraws to a deserted place by himself. The gruesome details of the beheading of John the Baptist no doubt were part of what Jesus heard. Also Jesus knew that King Herod did not like the Baptist and that he would no doubt now set his sights on Jesus, whom the Baptist had proclaimed was the one coming from God. But Jesus' isolation is soon disturbed by people finding him.

Like ourselves, it is a luxury for most of us to have time just to be by ourselves. The children, our spouse, a friend, or just the demands of work soon press onto our lives. So too with Jesus. And he realizes that his own problems certainly do not equal that of the crowds before him with all of their sicknesses and he is moved with pity for them. He starts to cure as well as to provide for their basic human needs. You almost sense by the end of this passage that Jesus is surrounded by his apostles and then this massive crowd of people who are seated all around him in a peace that is the foreshadowing of the Kingdom Jesus came to build.

Two transitional deacons will be ordained on Aug. 1 as priests for service in the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland. The Mass -- which is restricted to invited guests only -- will be livestreamed at 10 a.m. on the diocesan website and broadcast live on Cleveland's Catholic radio station, AM 1260 The Rock. Deacon Joshua James Cochrac and Deacon Joseph Patrick Robinson will be ordained by Auxiliary Bishop emeritus Roger Gries. Deacon Cochrac is the son of Gwen and the late Raymond Cochrac. His home parish is St. Mary of the Falls in Olmsted Falls. After ordination, he will minister as a parochial vicar at St. Charles Borromeo Parish in Parma. After ordination, he will be a parochial vicar at St. Peter Parish in North Ridgeville.
