DUPED BY GOD

Such strong language from the prophet Jeremiah is found in the first reading of the Mass. It is language that as Christians we have difficulty understanding, let alone using, with reference to God. God does not trick people -- right????? And yet that is the sense of which the prophet is writing. While we may not comfortably speak this way, we may well sometimes feel that God has given us a mission that is all too hard to accomplish. For we realize that God's love and goodness has lured us into following him. But to follow him has brought sufferings that we would rather not deal with. And yet if we do not lose something of ourselves as Jesus commands in Gospel, we will not find the life we are looking for.

The way to life is Jesus' way of the cross. The Mass, which is the memorial of his Passion. Death and Resurrection, is also ours. During the Mass, I say to you, "Pray, Brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." Not only what is on the altar in the form of bread and wine are the the offerings, but everything of our lives. St. Paul reminds early Christians that their offering is also their bodies, "as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, our spiritual worship." Our bodily lives by which we share our life and love with others through deeds of love are made by the Spirit part of the worship of God!

"Spiritual worship" is not just in our minds or another world but they are all the realities that are "good and pleasing and perfect" discerned by us to be the will of God. God's love in Jesus has lured us into a trap but it is the trap of love and eternal life. I may feel like Jeremiah that God has duped me into his plan! But then I realize it is "a burning fire in my heart" that I have to continue to

live with and share as the Gospel of Christ. -- Fr. Joe
