#### ST. JOHN PAUL II

It was a hundred years ago that Pope John Paul II was born. What destiny was his was hidden from the eyes of his mother and father as they brought their child to the modest church of Wadowice for Baptism. And as for many swept up in the terrors and threats of the Nazis, life seemed constantly threatened.



There is the story of how he was hit by a transport truck and lay injured and surprisingly was taken to hospital on the orders of a local Nazi officer, who usually would not have otherwise helped an injured Polish man! Destiny? The strange workings of the Holy Spirit? A moment of humanity beneath the Nazi uniform? Secreted away in the Archbishop of Krakow's palace, he did his seminary work and would be raised to be Bishop of Krakow and then Bishop of Rome. His acting ability invested his papal actions with a dramatic effect unlike his predecessors. His intelligence enabled him to write deeply philosophical reflections on the issues of the day. His personality electrified the crowds all over the world. He did not always have it easy. In Cuba, a silent and reverential Fidel Castro listened to this Pope. Whereas in Nicaragua the communist crowds tried to shout him down during the Mass!

I remember the day he was elected Pope. I was in my office at St. Anselm Church when the secretary knocked on the door and said "Father, one of your countrymen has been elected Pope!" I was startled and had to say what do you mean? She said "HE IS POLISH!" Yes, there is a certain pride and connection because of that. But it is really important that while the choice was historic, his real importance to all nationalities and ethnic groups in the Catholic Church is that they realize he is their Pope, their father in the faith and Vicar of Christ! And he truly was able to balance a love of his homeland with his grave responsibilities over a universal Church . Remember how he would kiss the soil of every stop he made, which was a very dramatic moment at the beginning of each papal visit. He embodied being proud of where you came from but never discounted the origins of other human beings. We give thanks for this life and ministry for the sake of the Catholic Church and our Saviour, Jesus Christ! -- Fr. Joe



#### **CHANGE IN BROADCAST TIME FOR TV MASS**

Fox 8 television has changed the weekly television Mass Sunday broadcast time to one hour earlier -- 5 a.m. -- on Sunday mornings, instead of 6 a.m., starting on Sunday, Oct. 25, 2020.

The TV Mass can also be accessed on demand starting Saturday evening and running throughout Sunday on the Diocese of Cleveland website, dioceseofcleveland.org. In addition, the Mass can be heard on the radio, on AM 1260 The Rock, at 4 p.m. on Saturdays and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays.

Radio station WINT-1330 AM airs the Mass each Sunday at 9 a.m. and Cox Communications cable subscribers can view the Mass on Sunday at 11:30 a.m. on channel 45.
