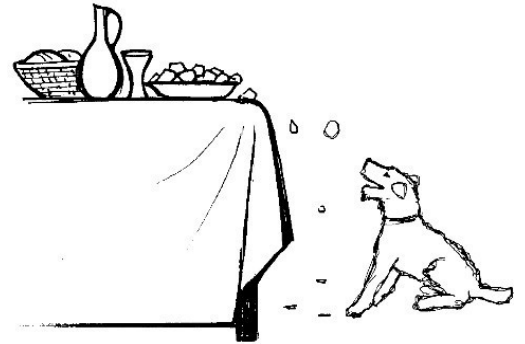

AUGUST 16, 2020 THE TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING — (Isaiah 56: 1, 6-7) The
last chapters of the book of Isaiah speak of
God's love of all peoples. The author pro-
claims that God calls all peoples to come to
him and to his holy temple.



SECOND READING — (Romans 11: 13-15,
29-32) Paul glories in his Jewish heritage,
while he is saddened by Israel's rejection of
Jesus. He is the great apostle to the non-
Jews or Gentiles. After all peoples have ac-
cepted Jesus, he foresees that Israel, too,
will come to the Lord.

GOSPEL— (Matthew 15: 21-28) In today's Gospel, a Gentile woman matches wits with
Jesus — and wins! Jesus invites her to faith by saying that it is not right to give children's
food to house pets; the woman's response is one of faith; she obtains her request.

The daily Mass time at St. Aloysius beginning this week will be at 7:30 am.

This is a temporary experiment to determine if an earlier time may have benefits. All are
invited to attend these Masses, which generally will be concluded shortly before 8. This
new time will be reevaluated over the next few weeks.

Message From Father

Things Catholics should know: *Why do parishes have daily Masses?* The daily Mass times at St. Aloysius are being reevaluated. I am intending to add a weekday Mass at St. Vincent's this fall. We are finally able to return to having weekday Masses at nursing homes and other institutions. All this is important to the life of a Catholic parish for the following three reasons.

First, daily Mass is the constant prayer of the Church. It is offered for particular people, for the needs of the Church, and for the needs of the world. In every Mass, the sacrificial work of Jesus' Cross is renewed in our time and in our community. Unlike any other prayer, the Mass is not the prayer of the people or the priest but it is the singular prayer of the Savior of the world uttered by the priest and people. Without the Mass, the work of Jesus truly and really comes a halt. Within the Church, we know that the celebrating of Mass continues to bring all that we need from heaven to earth. Of course this could be completed by a single Sunday Mass, but the wisdom of the Church and the experience of the saints tell us that the habitual nature of the daily Mass enables this work to be more direct and consistent. In other words, the grace of Jesus Christ continues to grow because the Mass is offered in the midst of the people.

Secondly, the daily Mass grants to individuals, both priest and people, the opportunity to personally grow in relationship to Jesus Christ. This is not just an opportunity to pray, but the greatest opportunity to pray while standing at the foot of the Cross of our Lord as He presents His offering to the Father. With the prayers and reading of Scripture, as well as the silence and Communion, the faithful who attend the daily Mass grows quickly and profoundly closer to God. Therefore, pastors of parishes are asked to give the faithful opportunities to attend Masses, not only on Sundays, but also throughout the week. A personal note, without daily Mass, priests can very easily lose their direction and become simply parish workers. Thirdly, the daily Mass is a constant call for the entire community, both Catholic and non Catholic, to recall that God is the supreme good. We can gather, pray, read, preach, sing, kneel, light candles, and receive Communion EVERY DAY, Daily Mass is a commitment to service of God. It is a personal and communal sacrifice. Our world needs to have the Church committed to this service most especially now. All around us the world calls for selfish interest, and the Church continue to say: Give to God. Surrender to Him.


Not every Catholic needs to attend Mass every day. However, every Catholic should at least from time to time attend a Mass which is not required by Sunday obligation so that they can become something greater. ***It is a sacrifice. It is a privilege. It is a vocation. Daily Mass is a blessing.***
