AUGUST 18, 2019 TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING — (Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10) The life of a faithful prophet is not comfortable. Jeremiah predicted the impending destruction of Jerusalem as God's judgment on Israel's unfaithfulness. Because he would not recant from the word of God, authorities throw the prophet into a pit where he experiences isolation and suffering. Sometimes, to be faithful to God means we have to accept separation from others.

SECOND READING — (Hebrews 12: 1-4) The journey of faith is life-long and it is a struggle. The Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that we have the communion of Saints to encourage us on our way, and the goal which is Jesus Christ. The Lord suffered so that we might not give up our journey to heaven.

GOSPEL — (Luke 12: 49-53) In today's gospel, Jesus relishes the opportunity to set the world on fire with his gospel. Even though he will be met with fierce opposition, he looks forward to the coming spiritual battle. The simple absence of conflict is not the aim of the gospel; rather, the peace of Christ will only be known when the Christian faith is practiced by men and women in society. Ironically, division and conflict often come to those who work for truth and justice in the world.

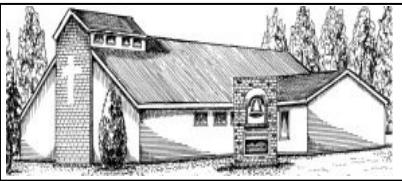
