

AUGUST 23, 2020 THE TWENTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING — (Isaiah 22: 19-23) The first reading today describes the replacement of one palace official with another at the time of Isaiah. The Church has selected the reading for today, however, because it gives the meaning of words which Jesus used eight hundred years later when he gave St. Peter first place of authority in the Church. Today's reading uses the expressions "the keys" and the ability "to open and shut." We shall hear these words used again in today's Gospel.

SECOND READING — (Romans 11: 33-36) In his mysterious providence, God chose to exercise divine authority through weak human beings. He could have done differ-



GOSPEL— (Matthew 16: 13-20) Today's Gospel is the conferral of authority on St. Peter after he professes his faith that Jesus is the Messiah. Simon Bar-Jonah was an impetuous, rough, simple fisherman; yet Jesus gives him divine authority over his Church. If we are faithful to Jesus Christ, we must be faithful to the successor of St. Peter.

Announcement

The Sacrament of Penance, Confession, will be celebrated now in the Confessional. However while still dealing with Covid, all Confessions will be heard behind the screen. If you are unable to kneel, please stand behind the screen to receive the Sacrament. Also, remember to not stand too close any other person while you approach the Sacrament, both those waiting to enter the confessional, or people in the pews. Confessions will be offered on Saturdays from 4 to 4:45 pm and before daily Mass. (at 7:10 am) at St. Aloysius. Confessions will be heard after Mass on Sunday morning at St. Vincent's and on Tuesdays at 6:40 pm.

Beginning this week a regular scheduled Mass will be offered at St. Vincent's during the week. We will have Mass on Tuesdays at 7 pm. This Mass could move to a different day of the week or different time if the circumstances require.

The diocese of Fargo has issued a series of instructions and requirements concerning the upcoming CCD year. Father Sautner and the director of the program have been consulting. We are planning to schedule our classes as they have in the past years.



There will be several procedures in place to help keep all healthy and safe. Classes will begin in mid September. More information will follow. A meeting the parents before classes resume to discuss these issues. We also ask that people be generous in their response to the requests the parish makes for help in this program.

Message From Father

<u>Things Catholics should know</u>: *Bells, bells, bells*. Bells within the life fo the Church has deep roots. In the earliest days of legalized Christianity, in the fourth century, the Church has used bells as a public sign of the faith. They are used to announce great events, proclaim moments of mourning, summon people to attention, and mark the passing of time. Their silence marks moments of reflection.

The saints have commented that bells are the voice of Christ calling us to be attentive. Henry Wadsworth Longfellew remarked that bells are the voice of the church in joy. Large Church bells in towers are blessed with holy water, anointed with holy oil, and named, just as happens to infants at their baptism. They are rung to announce the beginning of Liturgy, to express joy on feasts and at weddings, and they toll at funerals. They ring so that the Church can announce to all the world, to believer, non believer, and pagan, that God is reigning and that the Catholic Church is praying for the world.

Smaller bells, chimes and gongs, inside the church ring to enhance moments of prayer and add solemnity to the Liturgy, as well as announcing to those present to raise their eyes and hearts to God upon His altar. Sometimes people are distracted by bells, but this is good. Bells in the Church pull the faithful out of their own thoughts and prayers to join together with those around them to worship the unseen God made flesh.

In my first assignment as pastor of St. Mary's Church in Lakota, I would have the Church bells ring at the beginning of the Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve. Every year on the 26th of December I would get a phone call from a Lutheran lady who lived next door to the Church complaining about the bells in the middle of the night. I would express my sorrow for having bothered her and wish her Merry Christmas. Yet the next year the bells would ring. The year that I had left Lakota, I received a Christmas card, after Christmas, from this woman expressing her sadness of not hearing the bells that year. She commented that it seemed as if Christ was not born that year.

Before Masses and durning Masses, we will use bells the the following reasons:

Before Liturgy about 3-5 minutes before we begin to announce to the entire community that the Catholics are praying. At noon and 6 pm (in Lisbon), to call all to pray. (This may take some time to make sure the automatic timer is working properly) After Mass on the most solemn feasts: Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Pentacost as a sign of joy. Also at weddings. Tolling the bell at the conclusion of Funerals to call all to pray for the deceased and to respect the mourners. (One toll for each year of life)

In the Church during Mass before the Consecration, after the Consecration of the Body and Blood of Christ, and before Communion. --Father Sautner
