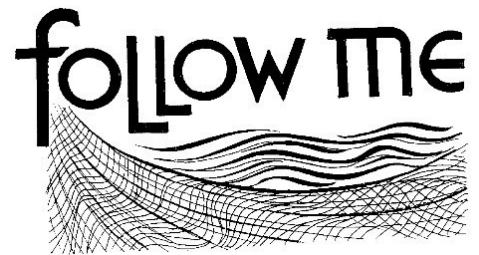

FIRST READING — (Jeremiah 20: 7-9) Jeremiah probably thought it would be easy to be a prophet of the Lord. It was not. He was called to speak an unpopular message. He complains that the Lord duped him and he wants to keep quiet. But the message burned within him; he simply had to be loyal to the Lord.

SECOND READING — (Romans 12: 1-2) God's ways are not always our ways. Paul urges us to follow God's way of sacrifice and not man's way of the easy and convenient.

GOSPEL— (Matthew 16: 21-27) Today's Gospel continues last Sunday's Gospel. After Peter's profession that Jesus was the Messiah, and after Jesus conferred great authority on him, Jesus says that he is going to Jerusalem to suffer and die. Peter could not accept this, for Jewish tradition held that the Messiah was always victorious and triumphant. But God's ways aren't ours: Jesus' victory comes about through humility and suffering. If we follow Jesus, we also must share his cross.

Message From Father

Things Catholics should know... When should a priest be called.

Often Catholics are confused or unsure of when and how to contact priests when there are medical issues or personal problems in their families. It is always good to personally talk to Father about the situations you find yourself in as soon as possible. Waiting generally does not work well.

In cases of health issues, in past generations there were 2 or even 3 times the number of priests around, including chaplains in the various medical institutions. The ability of priests to be instantaneously available has been diminished as the numbers go down. In addition, in previous years many people stayed in their homes or were in local hospitals as their health deteriorated. This kept the local priests in closer proximity to the ill faithful. In our times, most illnesses are dealt with in larger institutions in Fargo. It simply takes more time for Father to be able to respond. All this points to the benefits of contacting Father as soon as possible. It is good for Catholics to inform Father when there is illness and also impending surgery. It is a very bad assumption to think that Father is being notified by the nurses or even chaplains of the various institutions.

In addition, families should contact Father about their situations and not leave it to second and third hand accounts. If I hear about a situation from a source other than a direct family member (parents, spouses, or children), I will not take action. Any other sources, Father must consider as gossip. Again in past times these communications were often considered sufficient, but not in our current culture. In recent years, many people have found it difficult to arrange for a priest, but keeping these ideas mind, will certainly help. One final thought. It is dangerous and spiritually disastrous to have the hope that a priest will be available at the last minute. Live a good life, stay close to the Sacraments, and cultivate a good relationship with your pastor: these things are sure ways of assuring that you will not be caught without the grace needed in the most trying moments of life and death.

In terms of consulting priests for personal, family, or moral problems, again the principle of direct and timely communication is important. Putting things off, thinking that they will solve themselves, or being embarrassed are some key reasons people fail to speak with the priest. Priests cannot solve all problems, but in most cases the spiritual guidance necessary is not about problem solving, but about putting the problem into the correct perspective and finding the correct tools for better and more grace filled living.

Priests are joyfully given the title Father. This is not for their ego or benefit, but for the good of the people with whom they live. The title is meant to remind all that the goal of the Church is to provide not simply a pastor of a parish, but a Father to the community. While this sometimes means that the priest has certain authority, it more often points to the reality that the priest in the parish is called to be loving, attentive, and wise. (Sorry, Father Sautner is a bit short on wisdom)

To this end, Father Sautner will be establishing regular office hours when you can be assured that Father will be in his office in the Religious Education Hall. Please pay attention to future bulletins for this information. Father S.J. Sautner
