SEPTEMBER 1, 2019 TWENTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING — (Sirach 3: 17-18, 20, 28-29) True wisdom is to recognize that all greatness and all goodness comes from God. The greater we are, the more we should be humble at God's blessings. All glory and honor must be given to God and not to self.

SECOND READING—(Hebrews 12: 18-19,22-24a) God appeared to Abraham in a fireball. He appeared to Moses in thunder and lightning and fire. He appeared to Isaiah in all his splendor and majesty in the temple of Jerusalem. But today St. Paul tells us that we should not seek spectacular signs of God. Rather, we should seek him in humility of spirit.

GOSPEL — (Luke 14: 1, 7-14) Today's gospel lesson is Jesus' teaching on humility. The scene is a banquet where everyone was hurrying to get the best and most important places. Jesus tells us not to do anything for our own reward or for our own glory. We should leave that to God who will reward our unselfishness on the day of judgment.

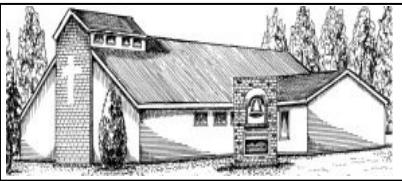
