FIRST READING — (Isaiah 55: 6-9) People are sometimes unforgiving. So often we show love only for those who love us, and do good only to those who are good to us. God is not like that; his ways are not ours. Today's first reading tells us of the great mercy of God.

SECOND READING — (Philippians 1: 20c-24, 27a) If we love God above all things, it matters very little whether we live or die. Let us strive to do God's will in all things, to serve him as long as we live, to love him in all we do.

GOSPEL — (Matthew 20: 1-16a) As we listen to today's Gospel, we should remember that parables have one main point; they are not allegories. They should not be extended beyond their meaning. The meaning of today's parable is that God is merciful even to those who don't deserve it, and that we must never restrict his mercy.

Sunday Afternoon Movie...Today, Sept 20, at 3pm, the movie, Man for All Season, will be shown. Snacks and discussion will be included. The movie run time is 2 hours. A Man for All Seasons is a 1966 British film directed by Fred Zinnemann based on Robert Bolt's 1960 play of the same name. The film and play both depict the final years of Sir Thomas More, the 16th-century Lord Chancellor of England who refused both to sign a letter asking the Pope to annul Henry VIII of England's marriage to Catherine of Aragon and to take an Oath of Supremacy, declaring Henry VIII Supreme Head of the Church of England. A Man for All Seasons was a critical and box-office success. It won the Academy Award for Best Picture at the 39th Academy Awards, while the cast and crew won another five, including Best Director for Zinnemann and Best Actor for Scofield. It also won the Golden Globe Award for Best Motion Picture - Drama and the BAFTA Awards for Best Film and Best British Film.

## Message From Father

---

### ***Things Catholic should know....The purpose of Spiritual Silence.***

Silence is a cornerstone of Catholic life. For both personal and communal welfare, silence is a virtue that ought to be cultivated. Now in our restricted lives, we may have a renewed opportunity to investigate silence more clearly.

Silence is an interior experience that flows from the an exterior of stillness and quiet. It is a lack of noise, but it also includes a controlled and minimal amount of movement. This stillness enables us to focus clearly on the presence of our eternal Father. This quiet is an imitation of our Lord's attitude in prayer and in conflict, as well as in His death. Silence is the realm of the Holy Spirit whose whisper is so easily muffled and distorted by the clamor of this world and our own frenetic action.

Silence begins on the outside of us. A reduction of noise and distraction. Turning off the world. A stillness. Only then can it move to the inside where it becomes a most beautiful thing. Often people will comment that they cannot be quiet, they must cough or fidget to get comfortable. But when our attention is grabbed by something terrible or beautiful or important, we can be settled down quickly enough to listen. On the inside, quiet must be imposed by our will to look upon God. This does not mean being free from distraction. But let us be honest, distraction is most often an excuse for a lack of discipline. Silence also takes time. We do not find stillness in a single moment, but it flows from the heart of our soul over the course of minutes. If a person has a difficult time finding silence, I encourage silently and slowly praying the Hail Mary in repetition. Our Lady, Queen of Silence, is a great model and giver of stillness. When we become quiet, the repetition may stop and a short word of thanksgiving to Our Lady for her assistance can be offered. Then in the time we have left, the life of the Trinity can grow with us.

Silence can involve reading, praying, looking, meditating, or offering thanksgiving to God. In silence we can consider our lives, but we ought to do so in reference to how God sees our lives. Silence gives us perspective and hope. It fills us with confidence and purpose. The irony, when we silence ourselves, God screams at us so clearly. And this is done both by ourselves, as families, and even in the Mass. There are several brief moments during the Liturgy when Father, the choir, and people are quiet. And then, from the great mystery of faith, God's voice is heard. Father Sautner
