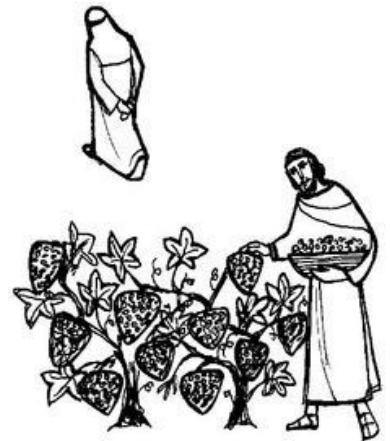

A short prayer service will be held outside the abortion facility, then those gathered returned to the Cathedral for Eucharistic Benediction. Message From Father

Things Catholics should know. CCD. These are three letters with which most Catholics in the United States are familiar, even if they don't know the meaning of them. **Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.** This began as a movement in the middle of the 20th century by the Bishops of the United States to assist parishes in the process of educating the youth of the Church. It was a program of lessons that were offered to each level of student development. The first universal curriculum for religious education in our country. Now, over the decades very few parishes continue to use this program set forth as the CCD, but the name has stuck. Parishes use different curricula from a number of publishers. Here in the Diocese of Fargo, all parishes use the same program which is published by Our Sunday Visitor. And it is a fine program. While we don't use the CCD text books or format, however, the name CCD is still very appropriate. The Confraternity which began as a universal gathering. Now is truly a fraternity, or brotherhood, within our own parishes. Priests, directors of religious education, teachers, parents, and students, and the lay faithful all work together for this most important task of passing on the faith. *Parents have the most important place in this Confraternity.* They promise at the baptism of their children to raise the children in the faith. It is from the souls of the parents that children first and most powerfully encounter the power of God and His Christ. This promise and responsibility cannot ever be dispensed. It is a sacred vow before God. The remainder of the CCD is to help parents fulfill this task. It is a gathering of Christian Doctrine. This means that the primary focus is to pass on the teachings of the truths of the faith. Sometimes the Confraternity moves away from this focus in an effort to be entertaining or socially relevant. These are misguided efforts. The Confraternity, lead by the priests, are to be a recurring reminder to our youth, and all people, of our eternal destiny, the majesty of God, the beauty of creation, and the dignity of the human person. We do this by a consistent and unwavering belief that the doctrine of the faith is not a boring relic of the past, but a vibrant and engaging truth that fills our souls with life. We begin our year of CCD these days, let us please pray together and as individuals that we, together, may fulfill the Commission our Lord has given us to teach all nations.
