OCTOBER 27, 2019 THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING — (Sirach 35: 12-14, 16-18) God does not care whether we are rich or poor, old or young, strong or weak, influential or powerless. God simply cares for those who are humble. God reads the heart, and not the words or externals. Today's first reading is from one of the books of the wisdom literature. True wisdom is to learn to be humble.

SECOND READING — (2 Timothy 4: 6-8, 16-18) We lose nothing when we lose ourselves in God. For he is our strength. He promises us a crown of glory if we shall empty ourselves to follow him. Today's second reading describes the last days of St. Paul's life. He has been abandoned by everyone. He is in prison. He has endured many hardships for the gospel, but he is confident that God will give him the crown of everlasting life.

GOSPEL — (Luke 18: 9-14) Today's gospel is the famous parable of the Pharisee and the Publican. Pharisees were renowned for being good and religious. Publicans were notoriously corrupt sinners. Yet God resists the hypocrisy of the Pharisee in favor of the humility of the Publican.
