"Saint of the Week" St. Dorotheus of Gaza (565-620), Abbot, Feast Day June 5. Presbyter, (like a bishop). I lived in a cave, doing penance. My ministry was to other monks and priests. The granddaughter of the Spaniard, St. Melania, once gave me five hundred solidi. I shared the funds with the other brothers. I kept three solidi. The rest I gave to another anchorite, Diocles, to distribute to those needy. His quote: He answered, "The woman whom You gave to be with me" (Gen 3:9-12), he did not say, "the woman deceived me," but "The woman whom You gave to me," as if he wanted to say: "This catastrophe has come upon me because of You." So it is, brethren, since Man is not accustomed to blame himself. He does not hesitate to consider even God as the cause of evil.

Dear St. Anthony Family,
