"Saint of the Week" St. Emily of Vialar (1797-1856), Patron of single women, Feast Day June 17th. At age 15 she was removed from school to be a companion to her father, now a widower; but differences arose between them because of her refusal to consider a suitable marriage. For 15 years, she was the good angel of Gaillac, devoting herself to the care of children neglected by their parents and to the help of the poor generally. Her grandfather died, leaving her a share of his estate which was a quite considerable fortune. She bought a large house and took possession of it with 3 companions. Others joined them and three months later, the archbishop authorized the Abbe to clothe 12 postulants with the religious habit. They called themselves the Congregation of Sisters of St. Joseph of the Apparition. Their work was to be the care of the needy, especially the sick, and the education of children. In the course of 22 years, she saw her Congregation grow from 1 to 40 houses, many of which she had founded in person. Her quote: "Let us have no other wish than to work for God's glory. Man's greatest happiness on earth is to be able to say that he does God's work in everything."
