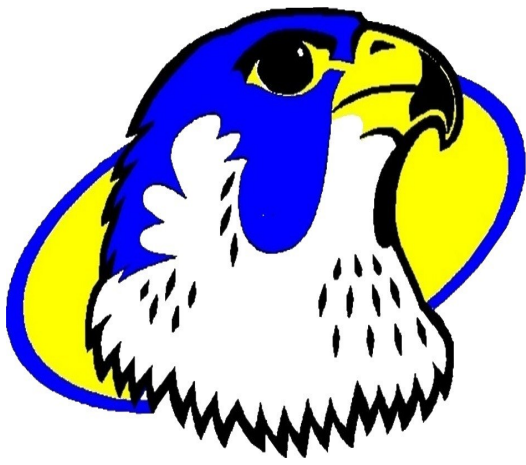
The Master Praised the first two but was angered at the third man because he did nothing to increase the Master’s Assets, noting that he could have at least put it in The Bank and made some interest.

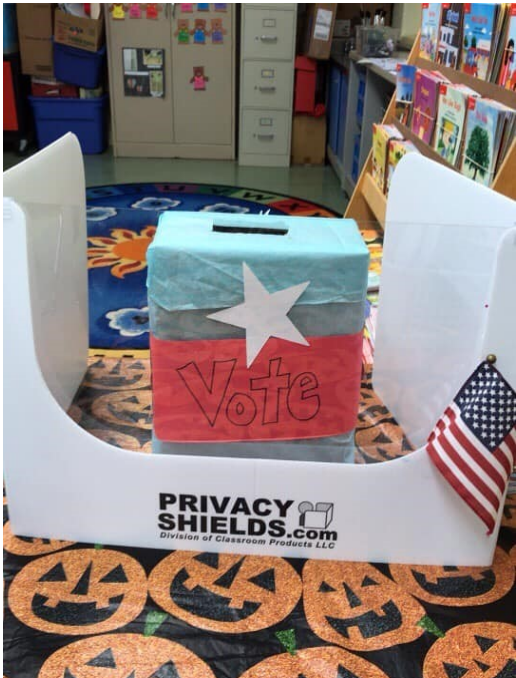
