Happy Easter! We continue our Easter celebration this weekend with Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Faustina was blessed to have multiple visions of Jesus, during which she created the familiar image of the Divine Mercy Jesus. Another gift from Jesus during these visits is the Divine Mercy Chaplet prayer. This prayer asks for the atonement of our sins along with the sins of the world. It is a glorious way to enter the abundant mercy of God. Although St. Faustina was given these blessings, many did not believe her. In fact, her Mother Superior sent her to a psychiatrist for fear she was suffering from mental illness.
