"Saint of the Week" St. John Baptist de La Salle (1651-1719), Patron saint of Educators, Feast Day April 7th. John Baptist de la Salle was born at Rheims, France. He was the eldest of ten children in a noble family. He studied in Paris and was ordained in 1678. He was known for his work with the poor. He died at St. Yon, Rouen, on April 7th. He was canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1900. John was very involved in education. He founded the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (approved in 1725) and established teacher colleges. He was one of the first to emphasize classroom teaching over individual instruction. He also began teaching in the vernacular instead of in Latin. His schools were formed all over Italy. In 1705, he established a reform school for boys at Dijon. He was named patron of teachers by Pope Pius XII in 1950. His quote is: "Pride makes us forgetful of our eternal interests. It causes us to neglect totally the care of our soul".

OHIO STANDS UP AGAINST INFANTICIDE ~ The Ohio General Assembly recently passed a resolution which urges the U.S. Congress to enact the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act. I am proud to see this action from my home state of Ohio and am working to further this legislation at the federal level. I am a co-sponsor of the Born Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act. This bill would protect infants born alive after an attempted abortion and give them equal protections under the law. Codifying this bill into law is the right thing to do. We must come together and stand up against infanticide and protect the most vulnerable in our society.

NO NEED TO FUND PLANNED PARENTHOOD ~ The 6th Circuit federal appeals court in Cincinnati upheld an Ohio law that allows the state to cut off state funding to abortion providers. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit said that Planned Parenthood does not have a due process right to perform abortions – I completely agree. The ruling upheld an Ohio law which restricted government funding from Planned Parenthood. With radical abortion policies being passed in the legislatures of states like New York, Vermont, and Rhode Island, it's never been more important to stand up for the most innocent in our society. This ruling confirms Ohio's leadership when it comes to protecting innocent life. Subsequently, the Ohio Department of Health announced it will end Planned Parenthood's funding in 30 days.

This Congress, I am a co-sponsor of H.R. 888, the Women's Health and Safety Act which would federally allow states to redirect funding away from Planned Parenthood, and other abortion providers.
