"Saint of the Week" St. Bernadette Soubirous (1844-1879), Patron saint of illness, people ridiculed for their piety, poverty, shepherds, shepherdesses, Feast Day is April 16th. As a toddler, she contracted cholera and suffered extreme asthma and lived the rest of her life in poor health. At age 14 she was sent with her younger sister and a friend to gather firewood, when a very beautiful lady appeared to her above a rose bush in a grotto wearing blue and white and smiled at her before making the sign of the cross with a Rosary. Bernadette fell to her knees, took out her own Rosary and began to pray. Three days later, Bernadette, her sister Marie, and other girls returned to the grotto, where "the vision" asked her to return to the grotto each day for a fortnight. She saw the Virgin Mary 18 times and asked the woman her name 4 times, and finally the woman said, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Church authorities and the French government rigorously interviewed the girl and finally confirmed she spoke truth. Sixty-nine cures have been verified by the Lourdes Medical Bureau after "extremely rigorous scientific and medical examinations". She joined the Sisters of Charity, spending the rest of her life working as an infirmary assistant and later a sacristan. She was diagnosed with tuberculosis and unable to take part in convent life. Her last words were, "Blessed Mary, Mother of God, pray for me, a poor sinner, a poor sinner." She died praying the Rosary and is often depicted in prayer with a Rosary, appealing to the Holy Virgin.

"Traveling Statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary Home Visitation Program" ~ Prayerfully consider to have the Blessed Mother's statue in your home for a week in the month of May or any time thereafter if desired. It is such a blessing for your family to have Mary with you in your home for the week as a wonderful opportunity to approach God through Mary. A few parishioners helping with the program will bring the statue to your home and help lead a prayer service to welcome Mary to your home. You are encouraged during this week to respond to Mary's request at Fatima to: pray the Rosary as a family every day, or at least part of the Rosary; make a special effort to avoid sin during her presence; and perform some form of penance or sacrifice during the week of her visit in reparation for sin. Those helping with the program will return at the end of the week to help with a prayer service to say farewell to Mary. The statue is then taken to the next home where the program is repeated. There is a booklet that comes with the statue to aid in the prayer service. You are encouraged to invite others for the welcome and farewell service in your home. 


