"Saint of the Week" St. Anselm (1033-1109), Archbishop of Canterbury, Feast Day April 21st. St. Anselm was a Benedictine monk, Christian philosopher, and scholar who is recognized for many intellectual accomplishments, including his application of reason in exploring the mysteries of faith and for his definition of theology as "faith seeking understanding". He composed dialogues and treatises with a rational and philosophical approach, sometimes causing him to be credited as the founder of Scholasticism. Despite his lack of recognition in this field in his own time, St. Anselm is now famed as the originator of the ontological argument for the existence of God and of the satisfaction theory of atonement. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Clement XI in 1720. As archbishop, he defended the church's interests in England amid the Investiture Controversy. For his resistance to the English kings William II and Henry I, he was exiled twice. While in exile, he helped guide the Greek bishops of southern Italy to adopt Roman rites at the Council of Bari. Every object served to raise his mind to God, with whom he always conversed in his heart, and, in the midst of noise and tumult, he enjoyed the tranquility of holy contemplation; so strongly was his soul sequestered from, and raised above the world.

Divine Mercy Sunday ~ Divine Mercy Sunday will be held at St. John's, Glandorf, on **Sunday April 28th.** Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be held at 1:00–3:00 p.m. Confessions will be available at 1:00 p.m. with Mass being celebrated at 3:00 p.m. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be recited at 4:00 p.m., Veneration of the Image, followed by Benediction.

The Novena to The Divine Mercy. In the Diary of St Faustina, we can read some of the following excerpts of what Jesus told St Faustina about the Novena. "The Lord told me to say this Chaplet for nine days before the Feast of Mercy. It is to begin on Good Friday."

"By this novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls." Jesus is commanding me to make a Novena before the Feast of Mercy, and today I am to begin it for the conversion of the whole world and for the recognition of The Divine Mercy... so that every soul will praise My goodness. I desire trust from My creatures. Encourage souls to place great trust in My fathomless mercy. Let the weak, sinful soul have no fear to approach Me, for even if it had more sins than there are grains in the sand in the world, all would be drowned in the immeasurable depths of My mercy. (The bold words are the words of our Lord to St Faustina.)

Our Lord gave St Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena. It is greatly recommended that the Novena intentions and prayers be said together with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. The Novena starts on Good Friday, April 19th and ends on April 27th, the day before Divine Mercy Sunday.
