"Saint of the Week" St. Hilary of Arles (400-449), Bishop, Feast Day May 5th. Bishop of Arles, France, and friend and relative of St. Honoratus. He was born to a noble family in Lorraine and was successful, although he gave up his secular career to join St. Honoratus at Lerins Abbey. When St. Honoratus died after being named the Bishop of Arles, St. Hilary was chosen as his successor in 429. He was known for his austerities, his aid to the poor, and for ransoming captives. On two occasions St. Hilary became embroiled in controversies with Pope St. Leo I the Great, but they were reconciled, and St. Hilary's sanctity brought him great veneration. His quote is: "The privilege of our Church is such that it is never stronger than when it is attacked, never better known than when it is accused, never more powerful than when it appears forsaken."

A Note From Father David.....

Dear St. Anthony Family,

This week's Gospel has Jesus inviting his Disciples to breakfast and is the third time he appears to them after the Resurrection. They had been "Out on The Lake" fishing and had caught nothing. He asked them to put their net over the right side of the boat, where they caught many fish. At first they didn't realize who Jesus was but later he invited them to share "Breakfast" with him. Jesus asks Peter three times "Do You Love Me?" After the third time, Peter is angry, telling Jesus, "Lord you know that I Love you" and Jesus says....Follow me.

It's interesting that Jesus asks Peter 3 times, which matches the 3 times that Peter denied him. Perhaps Jesus did this as a reminder to Peter that as "The Rock" which will build His Church, Peter must not waver in his Faith or Conviction. Jesus asks us the same question: "Do You Love Me?" and tells us to honor His commandments to show our Love. He also tells us that Loving Him means Loving those around us and treating them as we wish to be treated.

As we head to Pentecost, may we continue to practice what we learned during Lent and Holy week and continue to increase our Faith and build on the Love that Our Lord has modeled for us in His Paschal Mystery. When we can do these things with open and contrite hearts we can Live Easter each and every Day. May God give us the strength to do so.
