"Saint of the Week" St. Julian of Norwich (1342-1416), Theologian, Feast Day May 13th. Benedictine English mystic, sometimes called Julian. She was a recluse of Norwich, living outside the walls of St. Julian's Church. In 1373, she experienced sixteen revelations. Her book, "Revelations of Divine Love" - a work on the love of God, the Incarnation, redemption, and divine consolation - made her one of the most important writers of England. She wrote on sin, penance, and other aspects of the spiritual life, attracting people from all across Europe. She is called Blessed, although she was never formally beatified. Her quote is, "Prayer is the deliberate and persevering action of the soul. It is true and enduring, and full of grace. Prayer fastens the soul to God and makes it one with God's will."



Dear Parishioners,

Hello! My name is Brad McNeal and I am the seminarian that has been assigned to spend the upcoming summer months with you at St. Anthony's. Before I begin my time at St. Anthony's, I thought that I would tell you all a little bit about myself.

I was born and raised in the city of Toledo and my home parish is Most Blessed Sacrament Parish in West Toledo. I am the youngest of three boys in my family and currently have three nieces. I would go on to attend Blessed Sacrament School from kindergarten through the 8th grade. In addition, I attended Cardinal Stritch Catholic High School in Oregon, OH and then the University of Toledo, where I earned my B.Ed in Special Education. Immediately graduating from UT, I officially became a seminarian for the Diocese of Toledo and was assigned to do my seminary formation and studies at Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West in Cincinnati, OH. Being at the seminary now for three years, I have completed two years of philosophy studies and one year of theology studies. In addition, I have earned my M.A. in Catholic Studies from the seminary last year.

As a seminarian, I am assigned a different summer assignment each year. During my first summer as a seminarian, I was assigned to help lead mission work in Eastern Kentucky, helping with home improvement projects for those in poverty. Eastern Kentucky is one of the poorest areas in the country and was a truly humbling and eye-opening experience. Last summer, I lived and helped serve the parish community in Paulding County and Divine Mercy Catholic Parish. I will admit that since I am from the city, it was a little bit of an adjustment for me living the summer in rural Ohio, but I must also say that I very much enjoyed my time in Paulding County! Now, I will be spending this summer with all of you in Putnam County and am very much looking forward to starting and getting to know many of you.

Finally, I am aware that having a seminarian around will be a new experience for your parish and feel very fortunate for being given the opportunity to spend this upcoming summer with all of you. During my time at St. Anthony's this summer, not only will I be learning more about daily parish life with Fr. David, but I will also learn from you, the faithful community of St. Anthony's. Please know that the St. Anthony's parish community is in my prayers and kindly ask for you to please pray for me as I continue discerning the priesthood and for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life in the Diocese of Toledo. I look forward to meeting you soon!

Dear St. Anthony Family,


