"Saint of the Week"~ St. Joan of Arc (1412-1431), Patron of soldiers, Feast Day is May 30th. At a young age, she heard the voices of St. Michael, St. Catherine, and St. Margaret; and then had visions of them, each telling her to drive the English from French territory. With a donated horse, sword, banner, armor, and more, she quickly turned the Anglo-French conflict into a religious war. She was able to persuade Charles VII to allow her to march into other battles to reclaim cities, each of which ended in victory until she was captured by Burgundian troops. She was eventually sold to the English and then tried as a heretic and witch in a trial that violated the legal process of the time, denying her the right to a legal advisor. Despite the lack of incriminating evidence, she was condemned and sentenced to death by burning. Many women have seen Joan as a brave and active woman who operated within a religious tradition that believed a person of any class could receive a divine calling. Her quote is: "One life is all we have and we live it as we believe in living it. But to sacrifice what you are and to live without belief, that is a fate more terrible than dying."
