"Saint of the Week" St. Charles Borromeo (1538-1584), Cardinal, Patron of bishops, catechists, cardinals, seminarians and spiritual leaders, Feast Day is November 4th. At age 12, he dedicated himself to a life of service to the Church. His integrity was obvious. He told his father that he could only keep the money from his uncle required for his education and to prepare him for service to the Church and all other funds belonged to the poor of the Church. He may have fed 70,000 people per day. He had a strategy to provide education to many clergy and he founded schools and seminaries and colleges for them. He also ended the selling of indulgences, and ordered monasteries to reform themselves. His quote: "We must meditate before, during and after everything we do. The prophet said: "I will pray, and then I will understand. This is the way we can easily overcome the countless difficulties we have to face day after day which after all, are part of our work. In meditation we find the strength to bring Christ to birth in ourselves and in others."

Antique Shadow Box Mary Blessed Virgin ~ Take a few minutes to check out the antique shadow box of the Blessed Virgin Mary on the Faith Table in the back of church. Perhaps the most fascinating thing about this piece is its history. Apparently this shrine was created to commemorate those lost in the famous Johnstown, Pennsylvania flood of 1889. The statue of Mary is a copy of a phenomenal storm led to a catastrophe in which 2,209 people died. It's a shadow box that is lined in gold satin with an embossed gold background. Mary is most probably chalk ware. The wooden frame is exquisite. Within the glass in front of the figure is a paper plaque explaining that this was a Petition to the Blessed Virgin. The prayer says:

"Remember Mary, tenderest-hearted Virgin, how from old the ear hath never heard that he who ran to thee for refuge, implored thy help, and sought thy prayers was forsaken of God. Virgin of Virgins, Mother, emboldened by this confidence I fly to thee, to thee I come and in thy presence, I a weeping sinner, stand. Mother of the world Incarnate, O cast not away my prayer, (mention your request) but in thy pity hear and answer. Amen''

Dear St. Anthony Family,


I can certainly relate to Zacchaeus the Tax Collector. He wanted to get a quick glance at Jesus as he rode through the town of Jericho, but because he was so short, and the crowd was so large Zacchaeus ran ahead and climbed a tree waiting for Jesus to pass by. Jesus passed by and asked "Come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." This request of Jesus was quite unusual because Zacchaeus was looked badly upon because he was a Sinner and a sinful man.

What is most interesting in this story is the quick "conversion" of Zacchaeus after meeting The Lord. He gave half of his possessions to the Poor and promised that if he cheated anyone he would repay them four times over. This promise is remarkable when you look at a typical Tax Collector's way of doing business.

Hopefully we, too, believe that no matter what our transgressions, God is always here to lift us from our sorrows and grant us the pardons we seek. God's Eternal Love is with us until "The End of Time".


