



# Welcome Back to the Celebration of Mass At St. William

As of May 18th, St. William has resumed the celebration of public Mass. However, the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday has been lifted until June 28, 2020 allowing those uncomfortable with attending in person to remain home. We will continue to stream daily mass at 8am and Sunday mass at 9am for anyone preferring that option.

If you choose to attend Mass in person, for everyone's protection, please be aware of the following policies:

- \*If your health is compromised in any manner or you or someone you live with is ill or at risk, please stay home.
- \*By entering the church, you are acknowledging the potential risk for you entailed by entering a public location, and accepting that you will not be able to hold accountable St. William Parish or the Diocese of Venice for any illness that may befall you.
- \*You must wear a face mask at all times inside the church.
- \*Please enter through the front door and use the hand sanitizer before taking your seat.
- \*Sit only in the designated areas. Please adhere to the social distancing guideline of at least 6' between parishioners at all times.
- \*An overflow mass in the church hall will start 15 minutes after the regular mass if the church exceeds maximum capacity.
- \*Please follow, with no deviation, the guidelines for receiving Holy Communion.

#### What to Expect when Returning to Mass

As we return to public worship we will need to respect the restrictions and guidelines that the health professionals have provided. St. William Church joyfully, but cautiously welcomes parishioners to celebrate Mass together. Things may not be the same, but we are striving to balance everyone's spiritual and physical needs. Thank you for your efforts as we safely worship together.



#### Holy Water

Upon entering church, we have been used to dipping our fingers in holy water and blessing ourselves as a remembrance of our Baptism. Currently, safety precautions will not allow us to follow this tradition. We encourage you to continue making the sign of the Cross when entering the church remembering that we are baptized in Christ Jesus in the name of the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit.



#### Holy Exchange

The procession with the gifts is a powerful expression of the participation of all present in the Eucharist and in the social mission of the Church. It is an expression of the humble and contrite heart, the emptying of self that is necessary for making a true offering. Unfortunately, during this period there will be no collection by way of passing basket and no procession with the gifts. Baskets are in the front of the church near the altar. Offerings may also be made electronically or by mail.



#### Sign of Peace

The exchange of Peace before the reception of Holy Communion expresses the Gospel truth that communion with God in Christ is enjoyed in communion with our brothers and sisters in Christ. At the invitation to offer each other a Sign of Peace, a reverent bow and/or a verbal greeting is appropriate.




#### Receiving Communion on the Hand

You will receive the Sacred Host on the hand. Communicants are asked to proceed up the aisle with your mask on. After the Host is placed on your hand, step to the side at least 10' from the priest before you lower your mask, consume the Host then replace mask on your face. We do this out of a sense of care and concern for both ministers and communicants.



#### **Worship Aids**

As "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people" (1 Pet), we are led to full, conscious and active participation in the celebration of Mass. 

You are probably not surprised to learn that the pandemic has delayed our planned on beginning campaid the full planned on but we have not been able to come to an agreement with potential buyers over a figure that the appraisers and the diocese consider a fair price. With real estate prices lowering in this time of crisis, we have decided to remove the listings for these properties until the fall, when we pray the real estate market will regain some stability. Additionally, we have some parishioners who have made very generous pledges, but the volatility of the stock market has prompted them to ask for a delay in the fulfillment of their pledges. These developments have created a delay in the scheduling of our project.

Currently we have pledges of \$9,732,386, and we have received about \$6,600,000 toward the fulfillment of those pledges. This money is strictly reserved for the new building. Contrary to rumor, it cannot and will not be used for any other purpose. We always respect the intention of the donor.

Subject to changes in construction prices, we are currently required by the diocese to have \$10,800,000.00 in the bank to begin construction. In other words, we have approximately 60% of the money required to start the building. We still need the remainder of the pledged funds to be received and at least one of the donated properties to sell as well. We still have every intention of pursuing our project, but the start date is uncertain. We

will start as soon are we are able. Please pray for the success of our project.






## Monday, May 25th

As we celebrate Memorial Day this year, let us come together and pray for those who serve and have served, and say to these brave men and women and their families who await their safe return, "Thank you for your service



#### Pentecost Sunday May 31, 2020 Reflections on Next Week's Scriptures Jack Conroy, Ph.D

#### I. Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11 "...tongues as of fire..."

**Reflection:** "Pentecost" was the Hellenistic-Jewish name for "Shavuot," a harvest festival called for in Leviticus 23:15-23, and this called for an "assembly." Hence, the earliest followers of the Way were gathered together in obedience to Torah. The "wind" and "fire" are traditional symbols we find in the Hebrew Scriptures connected with theophanies, or manifestations of the presence of God. The "Miraculous" element is that each person spoke in a "different tongue," (or different language) so that each person heard the proclamation in his or her own language. This can easily mean that the Gospel is not limited to any social group, but is "heard" by each and every person regardless of native tongue. This has been caused for two thousand years by the presence of the Spirit.

#### II. 1 Corinthians 12:2b-7, 12-13 Spiritual Gifts

Reflecton: The presence of the Spirit in the Corinthian community was something that St. Paul had to deal with. For that community, ecstasy, speaking in tongues, and other exhibitions of enthusiasm actually produced divisions within the group, with one or more claiming superior "spirituality" because of what he or she could do. Hence, the Apostle points out the commonality of the Spirit in the entire church. He also points out the variety of expressions of the Holy Spirit in the recognition of the uniqueness of our gifts. Each of us has certain gifts, unique to ourselves, and products of God's grace. But since they are "gifts," we cannot take credit for them. Instead, we must recognize that such gifts work for the benefit of the entire community. This is an important lesson for us, today. First, we have to recognize that whatever gifts we have are "gifts," not products of our own efforts. Second, we have to recognize the gifts of others as being just as valuable to the community as ours are. Finally, we must all share our gifts for the benefit of the whole. St. Paul is addressing us and our divisiveness, not only the Corinthians.

#### III. John 20:19-23 The Johannine Commission

Reflection: For the last four Sundays, we have read sections from Jesus' "Farewell Discourse" in the Gospel of John. Now we jump past the Crucifixion to the original last chapter of the Gospel. This is the section just *prior* to that where Thomas makes his profession of Faith. The important elements of this section is the "sending" of the disciples (us) by Jesus. And at the same time as the sending, He brought the Holy Spirit upon them. While this is slightly different from the Lucan version in Acts, it involves the same elements, for the phrase "breathed" on them has great significance: this is what God did when He created humans (Gen. 2:7) or when God breathed life into the "Dry Bones" in Ezekiel 37:5. Hence, Jesus effects a "new creation," a "new beginning" of a different kind of life. Note also the dual greeting Jesus offers, "Peace be with you." We recall in his Farewell Discourse he had given his Peace to his disciples; here, in his glorified (wounded) body, he wishes the same Peace as a substitute for the normal "Do not be afraid" phraseology expected in a manifestation of God. The "commission" is not parallel to Matthew 16:19. Another translation of v. 23 is "those whose sins are forgiven, are forgiven; and those whom you retain, have been retained." The latter refers not to sins, but to the continued inclusion of members of the Johannine Community. And we, of course, are the successors to that community.



#### **GOOD NEWS OF PENTECOST!**

Without Pentecost, the Gospel is not truly Good News. For the seven gifts and Pentecostal charisms given by the Holy Spirit on this *birthday celebration* of the Church Catholic are essential for the success of our mission and indispensable for a joyful, victorious Christian life. If we really understood the good news of

Pentecost, we'd be different. Bold instead of timid, energetic instead of anemic, fascinated instead of bored. Compare the apostles before and after Pentecost and you'll see the difference the Spirit makes.

The gospel is Good News not just because we're going to heaven, but because we've been empowered to become new people, here and now. Vatican II insisted that each of us is called to the heights of holiness (Lumen Gentium, chapter V). Not just by will-power ... but by *Holy Spirit power*. Holiness consists in faith, hope, and especially divine love. These are "virtues," literally "powers," given by the Spirit.

### Health Ministry Minute

#### **RIP CURRENTS**

More than 100 people die as a result of rip currents each year in the United States. Rip currents are powerful, channeled currents of water flowing away

from shore and a common side effect of storms. They form as incoming waves create an underwater sandbar close to shore. The danger of rip currents is not that a swimmer is pulled away from shore, rather a swimmer may panic and attempt to swim against the current and tire.

If caught in a rip current, a swimmer should not fight the current. Rather the swimmer should swim out of the current and then to shore. If unable to escape the current, float or tread water.

Swimming safety includes knowing how to swim, never swimming alone, and if in doubt-do not go out.

Dear Fellow St. William Parishioners,

This week's bulletin contains a financial report on our parish's 2018-2019 fiscal year. Admittedly, we are a little late in publishing this report, but we lost two bookkeepers during that fiscal year, and we went for long stretches without a bookkeeper. As a result, we were late in assembling the data for the report.

Although we were fundraising for a new ministry center during the last fiscal year, our weekly collections remained sizable. Your donations have enabled our parish to pursue a wide variety of ministries, as well as to have a positive impact on our community. This is something in which we can all take pride. As a pastor, I can tell you that it is a wonderful relief to be able to focus on questions like "what does Jesus want" rather than "what can we afford." Thank you for your steadfast dedication to the mission of St. William Parish.

The report also shows that our parish is generous in its support of special collections that help fund various local charities as well as missions abroad. Your generosity to these collections shows a concern for the broader church, as well as for building toward the future. I am gratified to know that our parish makes a difference for those who can benefit from our help. Our parish also makes donations to Catholic Charities, St. Vincent de Paul and to Catholic schools. These donations not only help worthy Catholic institutions in our diocese, they also are deductible from our CFA assessment.

The Catholic Faith Appeal continues to be a financial priority for our parish. The CFA assessment amounts to 26% of the previous year's offertory and assessable income. Last year, our assessment was \$644,000. Parishioners donated \$689,000, leaving a surplus of \$45,000 which was returned to our parish, assessment free. We are not doing quite as well this year. Our assessment this year is once again \$644,000, but so far parishioners have pledged \$360,000, just below 56% of our assessment. If we fall short of our assessment, we will have to make up the difference by using money from our regular collection, money that will assessed at 26% for next year. In other words, for every \$1,000 shortfall in our assessment, it takes the equivalent of \$1,260 from our parish funds to cover the shortfall. On the other hand, if our parish's CFA donations exceed our assessment, the surplus is returned to our parish as non-assessed income for our use. It makes sound financial sense for us to do all we can to meet or even exceed our assessment.

One of the reasons for our difficulty in meeting our assessment this year is the fact that only 20% of our parishioners have made a pledge. This percentage is far below the usually excellent level of participation we usually experience. Please consider making a pledge to the Catholic Faith Appeal.

On behalf of the staff and the finance council, I want to thank you for your contributions to our parish during the past year, as well as your continued support during the Corona pandemic. I am truly blessed to have such loyal and generous parishioners.


