A Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron

On this sixth Sunday of Easter, we are coming to the end of the book of Revelation, the final book of the Bible. And we hear of the heavenly Jerusalem, a city with no temple—for the city itself, in its entirety, has become a temple, a place of right praise.

From the Pastors Desk

Greetings in our Risen Lord!

In last weekend's bulletin, I made mention of the upcoming Priesthood Ordination Mass for Deacon Tim Cone and his first Mass as the main celebrant the next day. Those are joyous occasions, indeed. Another one will take place on Sunday, June 2nd.

My first Pastor (as a parochial vicar), Roger Geditz, will be celebrating his 50 th anniversary as a Priest on Sunday, June 2nd at Holy Cross parish in Ipswich, SD. Fr. Geditz called me and invited me to come celebrate with him. Fr. Hal Barber, graciously, agreed to give coverage for the Masses next Sunday (8:30am/10:30am) at St. Dominic and St. Magdalen parishes. I will offer the Saturday vigil Mass at 4:30pm at St. Dominic parish and will leave soon thereafter to make it by 9:30pm to stay overnight at Sacred Heart rectory in Aberdeen. Ipswich is about a half hour west of Aberdeen. Fr. Geditz was Pastor at Sacred Heart, Aberdeen for the first two and a half years of my priesthood. He actually got reassigned to Watertown and I stayed on at Sacred Heart parish another one and half years under another Pastor, Fr. John Lantsberger. Holy Cross parish in Ipswich is Fr. I know I can count on you to make Fr. Barber "feel at home" next Sunday and assist him in all he needs for the celebration of the Holy Mass at St. Dominic and St. Magdalen parishes. God bless you and thank you for praying/sacrificing for Vocations to the Priesthood.

For either parish: If you have an interest to serve the parish in the capacity of an extraordinary minister of Communion or as a Lector, please let me know. For either service, training would be required by me. Besides the training, there are some qualifications to be met. To be an extraordinary minister Holy Communion, one must be a faithful, practicing Confirmed Catholic and this includes living in accord morally with the Commandments. In this day and age, it is necessary to mention this includes no cohabitation with someone who is not your spouse according to the precepts and teachings of the Church. To qualify as a Lector, a young person who is a faithful, practicing Catholic, but not yet Confirmed would still be acceptable. Obviously, to be a Lector, one must be a good reader and able to pronounce words clearly. Please contact me (Fr. Rader) within the next few weeks, so I can set up training sessions at each parish.
