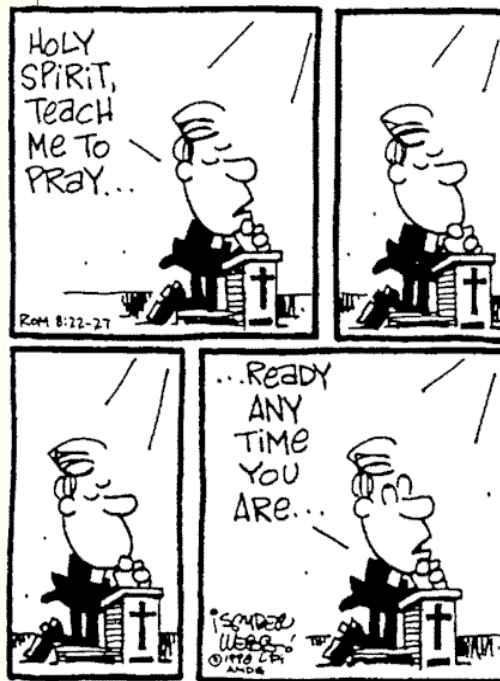

Greetings in our Risen Lord Jesus!

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost. The season of Easter comes to a close with it. With Baptism and Confirmation, we are given "Life in the Spirit" and many gifts from the Holy Spirit to live out our lives as Christians. Come, Holy Spirit!

It was wonderful to participate in the Ordination Mass of Fr. Timothy Cone and then the next day, at his Mass of Thanksgiving (at Holy Spirit parish!). He mentioned in his homily that it so happened to be his birthday too (June 1st). And thank you to all who assisted Fr. Barber at both Masses on Sunday, June 2nd, so it was possible for me to be at the Mass and Reception in honor of Fr. Roger Geditz's 50th anniversary as a priest at Holy Cross parish in Ipswich.

Volunteer leaders needed: We will need 3 parishioners to take the lead in organizing if we are to have a fundraiser meal this August. (It was determined that there are too many conflicts in September). In recent years, the parish had a chili cook-off. That option again would be fine or another idea can be settled on. Pentecost Voice The Holy Spirit, who came on Pentecost, gave voice to the apostles to proclaim the truth of the Gospel. The Spirit, the Soul of the Church, continues to enable the Church to speak, and enables us to speak in our individual capacity. As Cardinal Elio Sgreccia, former President of the Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life has said, "The Church must speak out in today's context on fundamental rights, the right to justice, the right to peace, but above all and in the first place, the right to life. If the Church did not speak, did not proclaim the truth, it would be abandoning its duty; it would be unfaithful to society, to the good of society. Therefore, its precise duty is the very liberty to intervene with word, and also with example -- the example of promoting human life, of intervening for the salvation of mankind."

The Weekend Warriors, which originated from Empower Canton, is recruiting committee members for their planning team. The group has recharged and is ready to make a difference in this beautiful town that we call home.
