

## **Dominic's Den**

Bishop Ivo Odrowatz, the Polish bishop of Krakow, was witness to Dominic's miracle of raising Napoleon Orsini, nephew of Cardinal Stephen, to life at San Sisto. The bishop's two nephews, Ceslaus and Hyacinth, and two companions, Henry of Moravia and Herman the Teutonic, were also witnesses. The bishop begged Dominic to send some of his friars to Poland, but the difficulty of the Polish language was an obstacle. Instead Dominic told the bishop, "My lord, you have with you four young clerics; give them to me. I will clothe them with our habit, form them to apostolic virtues, and return them to you in a short time full of zeal and devotedness." After 6 months of study with Dominic, the four new friars returned to Poland and began to preach the Gospel and founded five Dominican houses, which became centers of learning and preaching. Ceslaus traveled to Prague, Breslau, Bohemia, Pomerania, and Saxony. Hyacinth traveled throughout northern Europe, including Denmark, Sweden, and Norway, and even into parts of Russia. St. Hyacinth of Poland was canonized on April 17, 1594 (feast day August 17) and Blessed Ceslaus was beatified on August 27, 1712 (feast day July 17).

After Vatican II, the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July so Catholics can reflect on this beautiful image of Jesus' love for humankind! Though no longer on the current liturgical calendar, the month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Precious Blood. This dedication is a beautiful way for Catholics to continually remind themselves of Jesus' immense sacrifice of offering Himself, not only on the Cross but at every Mass.
