



THIS WEEK

PASTOR'S CORNER



Friends.

I write this column after having celebrated four masses for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (also known as the Feast of Corpus Christi). The emphasis of my preaching was the absolute need which we, as Catholics, have for clear and unqualified belief that the very Body and Blood of Christ is offered

to us in the celebration of the Mass. I rarely use my column to look to something as recent as my latest homily. But, in my mind as I preached last weekend's homilies about the Real Presence of the Lord in the Body and Blood received at Mass, were two very troubling recent incidents.

Twice in the two weeks before the Feast of Corpus Christi, after a Sunday Mass, parishioners found hosts which were simply laying in pews. Appropriately, the parishioners immediately brought what they found to the sacristy. Since unconsecrated hosts are not generally available at Mass, this means that these were consecrated. Meaning – those hosts were the Body of Christ. It further means that someone chose to accept the Body of Christ as given by a minister, and then to not consume it. Most troubling, a choice was then made to simply discard this most precious gift.

The reverence we are called to show the Blessed Sacrament may be open to some slightly varied actions. On one level priests have various approaches to purifying the sacred vessels after communion, or for the ablutions (washing) of their hands before and after. Lay Catholics have the decision to make about receiving the Eucharist in the hand, or on the tongue, or how intentionally, reverently, and profoundly to make genuflections toward the tabernacle at the start and end of Mass.

While some of these things might entail differences to be respectfully discussed, something that is not open for variance or debate is that the Body and Blood of Christ require of us clear internal belief and obvious external reverence. In my homily I noted the incredibly sad fact that a PEW Research Poll in 2019 found that less that one third of self-identified Catholics actually believe that consecrated bread and wine at Mass truly become the Body and Blood of Christ.

I have contemplated that as a pastor, maybe I have lacked the attentiveness to the necessary level of intentional reverence as in regards to these things. Should I demand more? I have wanted to avoid introducing elements of a "culture war", with theo-political sides to be taken, and conflict among well-meaning parishioners to come about. But, at some point, there is strong evidence of reasons to worry. Worry as a pastor about expectations; worry as a parent about what is being exemplified to our children; worry as a Catholic about our own responsibility to fulfill our Baptismal commitments to believe in those things which Jesus gives us.

My desire today is not to scold. Rather, awareness needs to be raised. Greater intentional reverence of the Blessed Sacrament will serve all of us very well. The nourishment of receiving the Eucharist will be all the greater. The value of Adoration (Tuesdays at St. Eugene and Thursdays at St. Monica) will be all the deeper.

It is logical to point out that what is shown outwardly reflects what is believed inwardly. But, if we (in our human condition) need a stronger inward belief, reinforcement and bolstering of our belief in the Real Presence will come from greater and more intentional outward signs of reverence. We will all benefit from this.


