NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It's hard for me to believe but I finally get to "officially" start as your new pastor! I drove back to Sioux Falls on August 2nd and have been getting settled in since. For those of who have gone through major transitions in life, like getting a new job, you know how the first couple weeks can feel like drinking from a firehose and that is certainly how I feel! So, thank you ahead of time for being patient with me as I learn and adjust to this new role.

Just a reminder, I was outside of Chicago at a retreat center for the entire month of July. I was making a 30-day silent retreat known as the "Spiritual Exercises" developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola. After a few days of the retreat, I learned why they are called "exercises"; it was a lot of work! I was expected to pray 4-5 hours a day in addition to meeting with a spiritual director every day. During the month, I prayed with God's love, my own sinfulness and God's mercy, the life of Jesus, his death and resurrection, and my own call that God has for me. It was an incredible experience and God gave me so much more than I was even expecting. The retreat almost felt like a "second priestly ordination" for me, it was that powerful. There would be way too much to share in an article like this but here are a couple things I learned.

1) Everything God does is because he loves you and me. I know that seems obvious, but just think all of creation (stars, planets, bugs, breezes, ice cream, rain, etc), it is all for you. Not only that but the incarnation of Jesus is for you, the saving act of Jesus' death and resurrection is for you. Why would God do all this for you? Because he loves you and wants you to be with him forever.

2) Our weaknesses are not a problem. We can so often think that our weakness, our foibles, our spiritual poverty somehow keeps God away from us. This could not be further from the truth! In reality, all of our human weakness and messiness are actually the very things that attract God to us! God loves to pour his mercy into our misery. This means that we should have so much joy and confidence when we bring our struggles to God.

3) God has a unique call for each one of us, and our unique call is wrapped up in the mission of Jesus. What was the mission of Jesus? It was to save us by reconciling us to the Father! Every single one of us is meant to share in the saving mission of Jesus in our own lives and in our own unique ways. One of the best prayers we can pray is simply, "Jesus, how are you calling me to share in your mission?" You might be amazed to discover how personal the answer is to you!
