Sunday, March 13, 2022 SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

What in the world is the Mass? Is the Mass a worship service? Sure, but I can worship God in lots of ways outside the Mass. I can worship Him in nature on a walk; I can worship Him in a non-Catholic church; I can worship Him in the depths of my soul. Then what is the Mass? This the question we will explore this week as we look closer at the meaning of the Mass this Lent.

The Mass is the same sacrifice that Jesus offered on the Cross. Every sacrifice has a victim (the thing being sacrificed) and a priest (the one doing the sacrifice). When Jesus died on the Cross, he was both the priest and the victim. In other words, he was both the one being sacrificed and the one offering the sacrifice. The same is true for the Catholic Mass. Jesus is the priest offering and the victim offered. This is why the Mass is the exact same sacrifice of Jesus, only now being offered in an unbloody way in the Eucharist. During this season of Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Jesus in a particular way. We might go to Stations of the Cross or pray the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary. Ultimately, we are meant to be reminded of the tremendous love of Jesus. He was sacrificed

out of love. Make no mistake about it, the Cross is not a sign of God's anger but rather the most perfect expression of His love. We are able to receive that extraordinary love every time we go to Mass and prayerfully enter the sacrifice made present.

The Mass is also a sacred meal. Remember that Jesus celebrated the very first Mass in the context of a Jewish Passover Meal with his disciples. At Mass, we do not simply watch the sacrifice of Jesus as passive observers but are actually drawn in to participate in that sacrifice. We do that through communion with Jesus. We are privileged to eat the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Lord of the Universe. When we receive the Eucharist, what looks like bread and wine is really the True Presence of Jesus, King of Love. When we approach the altar for communion, we are approaching the table of love prepared for us by Jesus who died out of love for us. I then receive the grace and strength I need to sacrifice myself for others in the same way Jesus did for me. So what in the world is the Mass? It is the sacrifice by which God pours His love on us; it is the feast by which we are able to receive that love and then share it with others.


