THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Waiting is hard. In our age of instant gratification with smartphones giving us immediate information and Amazon giving us any product under the sun in two days, waiting can feel agonizing. We live in a society when everything seems to happen at the speed of light, so if we are told that we have to wait for something, we almost feel cheated. God, on the other hand, seems to have no problem with waiting. St. Peter tells us in his second letter, "But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day" (2: Peter 3:8). God, who lives in the reality of eternity, does not deal with time in the same way that we do. While we look for instant gratification, God is in the long game, slowly preparing and working to achieve his plan of love in the world. Just think, scientists say that the Universe is nearly 14 billion years old; this means that God waited 14 billion years to create you and me. And I think that if we were to ask God, he would say it was worth the wait!

The Church wisely gives us a season to practice waiting. It is the season of Advent that we are currently living. It is a season of preparation. It is a season to curb our desire for instant gratification by entering into the eternal reality of God. This can be illustrated with the tradition of putting presents underneath the Christmas tree.

Every single person wishes he or she could open gifts right away. Yet, we know that there is grace in waiting till Christmas. In fact, the waiting is part of what makes opening the gifts so enjoyable. As we waited, our desire for the gifts grew so that our pleasure in receiving the gifts could grow too. Herein lies the wisdom of waiting. Waiting increases our desire and when our desire grows, so too does our capacity to receive the good. In other words, we can actually receive more goodness by waiting.

I realize that it is nearly impossible to avoid the consumeristic nature of secular Christmas. We are bombarded by Christmas music, Christmas decorations, and constant messaging that we are in Christmas now. Yet, as hard as it is, we should do what we can to appreciate the period of waiting that we are in during this season of Advent. Perhaps, we can take some time for some extra prayer, silence, and even fasting as we wait for Christmas. The waiting is not easy, but it will make the joy of Christmas that much more profound. Remember, God takes his time. He is not rushed. He is eternal. May this Advent be an opportunity for us to slow down and wait with God.
