I think this is one of the most powerful aspects of an education; a true education is able to form the whole human person. A well-educated person will be a virtuous person, who feels responsible for making the world a better place, who knows how to live in healthy relationships with others, who is truly wise-meaning, they use their knowledge for the good of others.

One could say that Jesus came to help educate us. He is the Teacher of Teachers. Jesus did not come to simply transmit knowledge or facts to us. Rather, Jesus sought to form a new people, a new humanity. He gave us the Kingdom of God in which we can live differently. It is only through Jesus that we can truly live a god life, one that is for others. We might only be in formal religious education classes for several years, but our education in Christ is a life-long process. We never graduate from the school of the Gospel. In fact, every single day is "the first day of school" when Jesus is our teacher. Every day is a new adventure with Jesus as he forms us more and more into the person we were created to be.

One more thing, we really do need classmates in education in the Gospel. This is not a class that we can do an "independent study" in. Christian community is absolutely essential to our growth in holiness. It is my hope that our parish can be a place where we walk together, learn together, and grow together. We are all students of Jesus and his Gospel (myself included!) and so we need to support one another. I hope each time we gather as a parish it can have all the excitement of that first day of school.
