A Note from Sister Anne Heath, RSM

Next week, parishes will hold the Retirement Fund for Religious collection, an annual appeal that benefits some 30,000 senior sisters, brothers, and religious-order priests. As Christians, we are called to "serve the Lord with gladness." (Ps 100:2) Our elderly religious offer a shining example of what it means to answer this



call. "Advent is a time of standing still, and yet making a pilgrimage in which we stand still and yet walk a thousand miles." (Catherine de Hueck Doherty, in *Grace in Every Season*)

These religious have done just that during their active ministries. They worked to build Catholic schools and hospitals, promoted social justice, and embraced the neediest among us. In retirement, many continue to volunteer in ministry, and all pray for the needs of our Church and the world. Inspired by love, their service – past and present – is marked by joy and a deep desire to do the will of God.

In 1988, Catholic bishops of the United States launched the Retirement Fund for Religious to address the significant lack of retirement funding for Catholic sisters, brothers, and priests in religious orders. Religious communities are financially responsible for the support and care of all members. For most of their lives, they received a stipend rather than a salary for their ministry. The funding shortage is compounded by rising healthcare costs and decreased income.

By 2029, 70% of religious will be over the age of 70. In addition to direct financial assistance, proceeds from the annual appeal underwrite educational programming, services, and resources that enable religious communities to evaluate and prepare for long-term retirement needs.

Your support will both financially and spiritually give flesh to the words of Ps 100:2, "to serve the Lord with gladness." We are grateful to and for you, and all that you do for us, the Church, and our world. Your generosity is beyond measure. Your support is exceptional. Let's pray for one another.



It is a journey to see how gospel values and the truths of the faith can be lived. Candidates and catechumens are mentored throughout the process by a team of catechists and sponsors.
