

GRACE AND HOPE

Which should we do? Turn our backs on our loved ones, or offer hospitality to all who come to us as Christ? Today we are told to do both, and yet there is no inherent contradiction here. Following Christ might mean that we need to be aware both that Christ comes first in our lives, and that losing our life for Christ's sake means to find it. We also are reminded that when we were baptized, we died with Christ, to sin and to the pull of the world, and live with him in a new life. No contradiction, no necessary confusion. Just grace and hope.

DYING AND RISING

The words of Saint Paul hit us smack in the face: "Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Romans 6:3). This epistle is one of the choices to be read at Catholic funerals. It generally comes as something of a shock to the listeners. But the reading goes on to offer great comfort to us as Christians. "[w]e have died with Christ . . . we shall also live with him . . . raised from the dead, [Christ] dies no more . . . [Christ] lives for God . . . you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus."

HOSPITALITY

One of the ways we live in God is to extend God's hospitality to all. As an old Irish rune says, "Often goes the Christ in the stranger's guise."

The woman of Shunem offered hospitality to the prophet Elisha in the form of dinner and a place to stay. He rewarded her hospitality with the promise of a son. Christ explains to us just what hospitality means: "Whoever receives you receives me" and shall not lack for a reward. As theologian Paul Wadell teaches, when we offer hospitality, we not only offer food and drink, or a place to stay, or other kindness, we offer ourselves; we offer our attention to a stranger's story, wherein we learn another person's perspective, and in doing so we listen to God's story.

In warning us that "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me . . ." and also, "Whoever finds [their] life will lose it, and whoever loses [their] life for my sake will find it" Jesus proposes that we cultivate detachment from things that we now consider primary in our lives. Christ loves us and wants

us to put him first before other commitments or desires. Our hospitality to strangers puts Christ before ourselves in just this way.

FROM SEA TO SHINING SEA

This week, on Fourth of July, we celebrate the birth of our country. When a baby is born it cannot take care of itself. It must be cared for and loved by its family and community. The same thing is true of a country.

Our country was founded on wonderful ideas. The Declaration of Independence proclaims that all people are equal and should be treated with dignity and respect. It also states that all people are entitled to certain rights, for example, the right to live a good and safe life, enjoy freedom, an be able to pursue what brings them happiness and fulfillment. These goals are hard to achieve. The require that every person work hard to make them a reality for everyone.

These goals need one more thing — the grace and care of God. It is important that everyone who believes in God ask God's blessings on our country so that it can continue to grow and be a light to other nations. Katherine Lee Bates, who wrote the words to the song, "America the Beautiful," believed this and included it in the lyrics. The song asks God to bless our country and unite all of its citizens as one people, from the Atlantic to the Pacific, "from sea to shining sea."

As you and your family celebrate this day with barbecues and fireworks, sing "America the Beautiful" together. In the spirit of that song, make a promise to pray for God's con-



tinued blessings, and to work to create a brotherhood and sisterhood of citizens throughout the entire country.

SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784) Feast Day: July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether SERRA different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego

to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan padre who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Saint Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.

A Message

Dear Parishioners,



n theI pray that you are all doing well and are staying safe. This pandemic has been devaspastor tating to us in many different ways. I thank God for the gift of our faith because it is only through Faith in Him that gives us comfort and peace.

Attached herewith is a letter from our Bishop Cantu to all the faithful in the Diocese of San Jose regarding the reopening of our parishes and chapels for public <u>outdoor</u> worship beginning on Monday, June 15, 2020. We will follow the directives of the Santa Clara County Public Health Officer, who at this time is permitting outdoor worship in groups no larger than 25 persons.

In order to facilitate an orderly way of accommodating this limited seating capacity, reservation is strictly required. We ask that you consider limiting your mass attendance to once a week or once every two weeks to give others a chance to participate at in-person mass and receive the Holy Eucharist. Note that the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect for all Catholics in the Diocese of San Jose until further notice.

- 4. Make a reservation for all members of your family attending the mass. The same email address may be used.
- 5. The confirmation email has a link to allow you to cancel or make changes to your reservation.

9am Daily livestream Mass
Saturday at 5pm outdoor Vigil Masses (2 masses)
(Confession Saturday 3-4pm parish center)
Sunday 8am, 10am, 12nn Live stream mass
7am, 5pm outdoor Masses (2 masses each)

All outdoor masses will be held in the School Courtyard. Please arrive 20 minutes before your scheduled mass.

For your safety, few things to remember:

- ⇒ Temperature check will be done prior to entry
- \Rightarrow Avoid handshaking and/or hugging

We can wave to say Hi!

- ⇒ Use designated entrance and exit only
- ⇒ Sanitize hands before entering and when leaving Sanitizers are provided
- ⇒ Mask is required at gathering spaces
- ⇒ Observe social distancing
- ⇒ Observe directives on receiving communion

- ⇒ Gathering at parking lots or within the church area after service is discouraged
- ⇒ When using the restroom
 - Observe proper decorum by cleaning/ sanitizing for next use
- ⇒ As an act of charity for the next mass attendees, please clean up with sanitizing wipes the chair you occupied
- ⇒ Wash hands always!

I do understand that this is far from what we expected when we re-open for public service. But know that we not only think about your spiritual well-being but also your physical well-being. We will update you as we receive changes in directives especially to the number of people allowed in a gathering.

St. Victor Church Re-opening of Church Celebrations Effective June 15, 2020

GENERAL GUIDELINES:

- ⇒ Dispensation for Sunday Obligation is still granted until further notice.
- ⇒ People who are in high-risk categories should refrain from attending public worship, parish activities, or coming to the church for private prayer and devotion, including
 - Persons over the age of 65;
 - Persons with underlying health issues or compromised immune systems
- ⇒ Persons who have been exposed to COVID-19 should not attend Mass or other parish gatherings.
- ⇒ People who are ill should refrain from attending public worship, parish activities, or coming to the church for private prayer and devotion, including
 - People with a cough or who are sneezing;
 - People who are feeling ill
- ⇒ Temperature check will be done before entry.
- ⇒ Social distancing is strictly observed.
- ⇒ Wear mask at all times and sanitize/wash hands frequently.

HOLY EUCHARIST

For Mass in Physical Attendance:

- ALL attending must be in good health condition
- Please arrive 20 minutes before the scheduled mass
- Limited seating capacity (25 people per outdoor area, including priest and lector)
 - Reservation is required for ALL masses.
 - * Call the parish office OR reserve on line at http://bit.ly/attendmass.
 - One reservation for each attendee (all members of the same household attending the mass must each have a reservation. The same email address may be used.)
 - * Those living in the same household to stay together
- Wear mask
- Sanitize before entering and exiting. (sanitizers provided)

- Receive communion reverently only by hands
- Observe social distancing while on queue for communion (please follow directions)
- Sanitize before receiving communion (sanitizers provided at the communion stations.)
- Stay until the final blessing and dismissal

- We ask all those who are present to wipe down the chair you occupied with disinfectant wipes provided.
- Dispose wipes in the bin provided
- Sanitize hands before exiting
- NO Bulletin hand out all bulletin contents will be available online
- ***Upon reaching your respective houses, please do not forget to wash your hands before doing anything.
