FOURTH SUNDAY OF Caster MAY 3, 2020

THE ONE WHO KNOWS US BY NAME

Today's readings tell about the confusion and fear that followed Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. In Acts, the people ask, "What are we to do?" after they are reminded that they were part of the death of Jesus, who was Lord and Christ. In First Peter we are reminded of Jesus' innocence. He did nothing to deserve the suffering and death that he experienced for us. Both the psalm and First Peter introduce the image of Jesus as shepherd. John's Gospel talks about Jesus as shepherd but not in the usual way. We recognize this shepherd's voice because he calls each of us by name. The confusion and fear we too often feel is calmed by the voice of the One who knows us by name.

WHAT ARE WE TO DO?

The readings describe that time when confused and frightened followers of Jesus looked to the apostles to tell them what to do after the Crucifixion and Resurrection. The answer seems simple. They must believe that Jesus, whom they crucified, is both Lord and Christ, both God and human. They must acknowledge their complicity in his death and seek forgiveness. They must be baptized. In First Peter the standard for their behavior is Jesus' behavior. Jesus, though free from sin himself, bore our sins and returned no insult or threat. Peter introduces the image of the shepherd who is the guardian of us who have gone astray. The Gospel emphasizes not the shepherd's leadership but that we are called by name.

LISTEN FOR YOUR NAME

The emphasis in John's Gospel is not on the leadership of the shepherd. The focus is specifically on the voice of the shepherd. We listen for the shepherd who calls us by name. We are not called to follow passively. We are called to recognize our name when it is spoken. We are to listen so that we can hear the voice of the One who knows who we truly are—not the external, transient realities like "I am a doctor" or "I am a mother." Our real name known to our Creator is much more than the roles we fill or the work we do. If my name is who I truly am, then I must listen for the One who calls me "forgiven" and "merciful" and "beloved." For this is my true name. This is my true nature.

Today's readings invite us to recognize our need for one who ensures our safety, nourishes us, and leads us to peace and security, like sheep who rest in the care of a good shepherd. Such a shepherd will protect and save the sheep, even from the most deadly of predators. Today, we ponder the incredible news that Jesus accepted death on the cross in order to open the gates of eternal life with God for us. Through his resurrection, Jesus protects and saves us from the power of sin and death. We need only accept his love and live as God's people in this life, relying on the Lord who is the door to new life for us and for all.

JESUS SAVES

Be honest with yourself. Have you ever gone astray? Have you ever given in to temptation or weakness? Do you sometimes feel that you need someone to help you get your life on back on track? Most people could answer yes to any of these questions. As people of faith, we know that Jesus understands the struggles we face and gave his life to save us from our human frailty. The Lord knows that we need help in order to live as God's people in the world. There are people and powers that seek to mislead us, who offer a way that may for a time be appealing, even though it does not lead to the true way of life, love, and peace. We can be readily dissuaded and distracted from the ways of holiness. We easily lose our way, lured by the trappings of material possessions, wealth, or social status. Jesus is our only real way, the door that leads to meaning and peace in this earthly time, and to life everlasting.

Dear Parishioners,

I pray that you are all doing well and are staying safe and healthy. It has been over a month since we have been observing shelter in place. These past weeks have truly been challenging for many of us. This pandemic has shaken all of us and has defined a new norm for our day to day activities.

Many of our own parishioners have experienced loss of jobs or reduced hours and this hit us close to home as we also reduced the hours of our own parish staff. We have reduced hours of all of our staff to 50% less than their total regular hours. We also reduced some operational expenses .But even with the reduced hours and reduced operational expenses, we are still operating at a maximum service. None of our pastoral services to all of you are affected due to this reduced hours. Our new office hours, however is on Monday through Friday, 10:00am to 3:00pm. We observe all directives from the county health department while in operation. All mass intentions can be done through phone or if coming to the office, please wear your mask.

Unfortunately, we do not yet have a set date when we re-open for public mass. I am currently writing procedures on celebrating our sacraments when we re-open for public celebrations. I will have them published in our website and sent to you through email at the proper time.

I continue to thank all of you for your continued support to our parish. We have an average of 40%-50% of our budget collected every week. You have been very generous to our parish. Please continue to do so. As you know, our parish operates through our income primarily from our Sunday collection. Your generosity to your parish extends help to everyone!

We also have our Food pantry through Second Harvest in operation from Monday through Wednesday 10am-1pm.

Let us continue to pray for one another.

San Jose Catholic Cemeteries is considered an essential business and we have all been very busy adapting our jobs to work within the current government guidelines. Our Family Service Advisors are meeting with clients to make burial arrangements and create markers, the Grounds Staff is developing new burial locations in addition to servicing the daily burials for our families, and Outreach is following up with our families and those grieving through phone calls, emails, Facebook and Zoom.

So, how are you? Have you thought about finally finishing-up those end-of-life plans? This can be a scary time for many and there have been lots of articles circulating about end-of-life and grief. Remember you are a child of God. *1 John 3, "The Father has loved us so much that we are called children of God."* Each day as I wake, I ask, "Jesus what can I do for you today?". As I come across daily situations, I ask, "What would Jesus do?". Some days are more difficult than others as outside pressures are put on us or our daily routines are abandoned. However, I believe this too shall pass and what we knew to be the norm may change but I will always be a child of God – who gives me strength.

God is here for you and Catholic Cemeteries is also. If you are interested in preplanning your burial <u>contact us</u>. If you'd like to create the marker for your loved one already buried in our cemeteries, <u>contact us</u>. If you'd like to create a virtual memorial for your loved one, visit our <u>website</u>. If you need a daily message of hope, visit <u>Solace</u>.

Jesus teaches that the way to full life is through facing death. I have seen this first-hand with family members who have faced death. I have tried to grow through my reaction to their hardship. This Covid-19 pandemic has also given me an opportunity to grow and share with others the importance of being present, mindful and responsible. I am a messenger. It is my responsibility to share God's message and support others through my ministry with Catholic Cemeteries.

So, I ask again, "How are you?". Do you need a quiet moment and place to take a breath and sit at the feet of Jesus to listen? Or do you need to get up, get out and be the hands and feet of Jesus to help yourself and others? Can't decide, ASK Jesus.

Know that Catholic Cemeteries is here to listen and walk with you and your family in times of sorrow. We hope to be of assistance and presence when you need us.
