

O Antiphons

Greetings on this Third (*Gaudete* — 'Rejoice') Sunday of Advent. The Lord is very close to us! All of our preparations, both personally and publicly, highlight our awareness of the nearness of the Lord. A longstanding tradition in the Church during the third and fourth weeks of Advent is praying the '*O* Antiphons', which refer to the seven verses preceding the Magnificat — Mary's song of praise to God at the time of her visitation to her cousin Elizabeth. These antiphons cover the special period of Advent preparation known as the Octave before Christmas (December $17^{\text{th}} - 23^{\text{rd}}$). These verses form the basis of the Advent hymn *O Come, O Come Emmanuel*. They are referred to as the '*O* Antiphons' because the title of each one begins with the letter '**O**', and each antiphon is a title for Christ coming from Scripture:

December 17th — *O* <u>Sapientia</u> (O Wisdom, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation.)

December 18th — *O* <u>A</u>donai (O Sacred Lord of Ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain, come stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.)

December 19th — *O* <u>*Radix Jesse*</u> (O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid.)

December 20th — *O* <u>*Clavis David*</u> (O Key of David, O Royal Power of Israel, controlling at your will the gate of heaven: come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death: and lead your captive people into freedom.)

December 21st — *O* <u>*O*</u>*riens* (O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice, come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.)

December 22nd — $O \underline{R}ex \ Gentium$ (O King of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart, O Keystone of the mighty arch of humanity, come and save the creature you fashioned from the dust.)

December 23rd — *O* <u>*Emmanuel*</u> (O God with us, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, come and set us free, Lord our God.)

The first letter of the Latin titles (underlined), when taken backwards, form the phrase **'Ero Cras'**, which translated means: *'Tomorrow, I will be there'*, thus echoing the theme of the antiphons. The Lord is indeed very close. May the joyful anticipation of the Savior's coming penetrate the depths of your heart, so that the brilliant light, joy, and peace of the Christ-child may be your strength and salvation!

Veni, Veni Emmanuel! Come Lord Jesus, that we may always rejoice in you!
