Divine Mercy Sunday

In the 1930s, St. Faustina Kowalska, a young Polish Roman Catholic nun and mystic wrote a diary recording revelations she received about God's mercy. The Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska: Divine Mercy in My Soul shares the message that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone—especially the greatest sinners. The message exhorts us to ask for God's mercy, be merciful to others and to be aware that God's mercy is dependent upon our trust in Jesus. The Divine Mercy image was painted based on her visions and Pope John Paul II established the Feast of Divine Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. Jesus asked that a Novena to the Divine Mercy begin on Good Friday by praying the Divine Mercy chaplet with a specific daily intention, with the most difficult intention of all on the last day: for the souls Feast of divine mercy of the lukewarm and indifferent that caused Jesus more suffering than any other. Jesus promised on Divine Mercy Sunday to “pour put a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who will approach the fount of My Mercy on this day.” He also grants the soul that goes to the Sacrament of Confession and receives Holy Communion in a state of grace on Divine Mercy Sunday complete forgiveness of their sins and the punishment due them.”

The actual Feast Day of Divine Mercy is April 11th but it is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday after Easter.
