THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

The question for us is what is the meaning of the Ascension? Or more practically, how am I going to live my life differently because of the Lord's Ascension? To be able to answer that, we need to look more closely at the readings for today.

In the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke remarks that after Jesus had spent forty days presenting Himself to the disciples, He promised them that they would be "baptized with the Holy Spirit" and be His witnesses starting in Jerusalem and spreading throughout the world. As Jesus ascends into heaven, the disciples stare into the skies, shocked and perplexed until two whiteclothed individuals ask them the questions, "Why are you standing there looking into the sky?"

In the passage today from the end of St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus speaks of "all power in heaven and earth have been given" to Jesus and from Jesus to His disciples so that they can go out to all the world and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them. Jesus also promises that He will be with His followers always, even until the end of time

What this says to me is that we are called and empowered to continue the work of Jesus. This is not just the call of the ordained clergy or pastoral staff. It is the call of each and every follower of Jesus. Each of us, as disciples of the Master, are given the ability, and responsibility, to further the spread of the GOOD News. As members of the Body of Christ (the church), we are gifted with what we need to further the mission of Jesus.
