## Gospel Reflections for Sunday

### **Matthew 11:25-30**

"Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves."

Matthew's Gospel offers an invitation from Jesus: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavily burdened, and I will give you rest." The audience for this message from Jesus is the people who follow him each day. Pope Francis describes those listeners as simple people, the poor, the sick, sinners, and those who are marginalized. The pope said these humble people "always followed him to hear his word — a word that gave hope!" In his ministry, Jesus spoke to them, healed them and encouraged them to speak to God as a loving father. Now, Francis says, "He calls them all to himself: 'Come to me,' and he promises them relief and rest."
