CLERGY CORNER Deacon Chris Hulburt

THE TIME IS NOW

When we baptize infants in the Catholic tradition, the pouring of water is followed by an anointing with oil. Sacred Chrism is used, prefiguring Confirmation, and the child is anointed "priest, prophet and king." By water we are reborn into the life of Christ. By sacred oil we are anointed into the mission of Christ.

Each Christian is "priest"—called to pray for and offer sacrifice generously for the world. Each Christian is "prophet"—called to speak God's truth into the world courageously by word and action. Each Christian is "king"—called to care for the needs of the people compassionately like Christ the Good Shepherd. These baptismal vocations

belong to all the baptized. We are to be God's hands in the vineyard, working with Christ to bring about the Kingdom on earth.

Sr. Joan Chittister is a Benedictine nun, a wisdom elder, and a courageous writer. Her most recent book, "The Time is Now: A Call to Uncommon Courage", presents a compelling invitation to all Christians to claim and live into the fullness of our baptismal vocation, especially the call for each of us to be prophets. The book is the focus of an upcoming 3-week study, and I invite you to join me and others on June 15, 22, and 29 at 7 pm for a virtual book group series.

"Prophetic communities do a great deal more than pray," Sr. Joan writes. "They study; they teach; they organize others; they add something of the things of God to the situation. They don't just complain about the poor; they do something to feed them. They don't just lament the condition of working mothers; they do something to help them take care of their children. They don't just wish for higher wages for the poor; they advocate for the underpaid. They lobby their leaders, their pastors and public agencies. They commit to doing something to change their world as well as to talk about it."

The Christian call to prophetic action flows from our core identity as members of the Body of Christ. We are intimately related to one another in God and dependent on each other for communion.

"After we've said our prayers, checked the news, shaken our heads over it, and turned off the TV commentators in despair and disgust," Sr. Joan observes, "we suddenly remember someone who needs the help we have just read about. Then we ask ourselves what we really stand for—and what we've done to prove it. At that moment, we either become prophets—or simply churchgoers. And that is the ultimate question, the question we must all answer, 'And you—what are you doing about it?"

I hope you will join me as we strive to be prophets, not simply churchgoers. The time is now.

THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

WALKING WITH JESUS—PRACTICE, PRACTICE

PRACTICE PRAYER AND SACRAMENTS

Whether you are exploring faith for the first time or you are a lifelong Christian—wherever you are in life—you will always have a next step you can take to help you grow as a disciple of Christ. To guide you on your discipleship path, we've developed S.T.E.P.S. to follow. Today we are exploring "Practice Prayer and Sacraments.'

Have you heard the old joke, "How do you get to Carnegie Hall?" Answer: "Practice, practice, practice." That can be said of our faith lives too! Just as prioritizing daily practice helps musicians hone their skills, giving priority to a daily habit of prayer and frequent reception of the sacraments helps us grow as disciples. Since Jesus' invitation, "Come, follow me"

S.T.E.P.S. **S**—Serve in Ministry or Mission **T**—Tithe or Give **E**—Engage in a Small Group P—Practice Prayer and Sacraments -Share Your Faith with Others

applies just as much to us as it did the first disciples, let's look to Jesus as our guide.

Prayer—Jesus gave priority to solitude and silence in order to be in prayer—in communion—with His Father. We see many instances in the Gospels of Jesus withdrawing from the crowds: when He began His ministry, made important decisions, dealt with the constant

demands of daily life, processed troubling emotions like grief, and prepared for important events.

Sacraments—At the Last Supper, Jesus gathered the disciples at table. He took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, saying "Do this in memory of me." (Luke 22:19). We do this every time we participate in the Eucharistic table at Mass. Jesus frequently spoke about forgiveness. He forgave those who sinned against others, forgave those who sinned against Him, and asked the Church to continue His healing ministry through the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Jn 20:22-23).

Prayer and the sacraments draw us into a deeper union with God and help us extend God's presence, love, mercy, and forgiveness to others. Would you like to take a step to develop your practice of prayer and the sacraments? Contact Maryanne Russell at maryanne@saintbrigidparish.org.

These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Please sit to receive the Word of God.

HOMILY

Please sit as we listen to a reflection from the clergy.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together. I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(please bow during this profession) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

UNIVERSAL PRAYER

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink. Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again. OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

THE GREAT AMEN

Amen.

COMMUNION RITE

Please stand as we pray together.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen. Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **And with your spirit.**

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb. Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**Go in peace. **Thanks be to God.**
