Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ: 4/25/2021

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, "Good Shepherd Sunday", also designated as "World Day of Prayer for Vocations", let us prayer for vocations to the priesthood! The unfortunate situation we face in the church today, especially in the United States and most of the western world, is a lack of priests to serve parishes. We do not lack parishioners in many parishes (yet, the numbers are dropping), and are thus able to maintain the parish buildings and grounds. However, priests serving in many dioceses throughout the world are responsible for serving in two, three, four, or even more parishes. It is a return to the early days of Christianity in the United States, when itinerant priests traveled by horseback to visit Catholic communities in a given area. Priests would often celebrate in large homes or gathering spaces made available for the faithful, until a church was built. It often meant that the people would gather on days other than Sunday, depending upon the arrival of the priest to celebrate Mass, hear confessions, preside at a funeral, and administer the sacraments. Today, automobiles make it possible to serve numerous parishes, all on a given Sunday (or Saturday evening). We know that reality here taking place in our own diocese. Parish closures and mergers of parishes are a painful process but one that should bring us all to humble prayer for more vocations. I am happy to serve two parishes and an oratory, praying that this temporary solution will be resolved one day through an increase of vocations to the priesthood. Let us do our part not only on this particular Sunday dedicated to praying for vocations but everyday, as I do at the end of every Mass. I am here because I am part of a charism in the church that has fostered vocations and seeks to fulfill the initiative of Pope St. John Paul II as found in his apostolic exhortation, Pastores Dabo Vobis (I Will Give You Shepherds), issued on March 25, 1992. Pope St. John Paul II stated:

32. Membership in and dedication to a particular church does not limit the activity and life of the presbyterate to that church: A restriction of this sort is not possible, given the very nature both of the particular church and of the priestly ministry. In this regard the Council teaches that "the spiritual gift which priests received at their ordination prepares them not for any limited or narrow mission but for the widest scope of the universal mission of salvation 'to the end of the earth' (Acts 1:8). For every priestly ministry shares in the universality of the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles."

It thus follows that the spiritual life of the priest should be profoundly marked by a missionary zeal and dynamism. In the exercise of their ministry and the witness of their lives, priests have the duty to form the community entrusted to them as a truly missionary community. As I wrote in the encyclical Redemptoris Missio, "all priests must have the mind and heart of missionaries open to the needs of the Church and the world, with concern for those farthest away and especially for the non - Christian groups in their own area. They should have at heart, in their prayers and particularly at the eucharistic sacrifice, the concern of the whole Church for all of humanity." If the lives of priests are generously inspired by this missionary spirit, it will be easier to respond to that increasingly serious demand of the Church today which arises from the unequal distribution of the clergy. In this regard, the Council was both quite clear and forceful: "Let priests remember then that they must have at heart the care of all the churches. Hence priests belonging to dioceses which are rich in vocations should show themselves willing and ready, with the permission or at the urging of their own bishop, to exercise their ministry in other regions, missions or activities which suffer from a shortage of clergy."

Please pray for vocations to the priesthood (presbyterate)!

The purpose of World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity), secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life.

World Day of Prayer will be observed this Sunday, April 25, 2021, also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2).
